

POLICE ACTIVITY REPORT NOV 27 TO DEC 5

On 11-27-2018, Montgomery County Dispatch asked Oak Ridge North to confirm a warrant on Francis Tremayne Comeaux (b/m; dob xxxxxx). I, Sgt. Barry, found one active Oak Ridge North Municipal Court warrant, capias pro fine - warrant #96263301, fine \$468.00. I advised Dispatch the warrant was confirmed. Dispatch stated Montgomery County Deputy Beatty, Unit #6P1041, was out at the Montgomery County Jail with Comeaux. I took the warrant to the jail and Deputy Beatty stated he would execute the warrant. Deputy Beatty booked Comeaux into the jail on the warrant. I returned to service. Sgt. Nation was advised of the arrest.

On 11/28/2018 at approximately 1008 hours I, Officer Stafford (Unit 2723), observed a white Chevrolet Silverado, bearing Texas license plate xxxxxx, westbound on Woodson coming to the stop sign at Patsy. Upon passing the vehicle, I noticed that the registration was expired as of 5/2018. I turned around and caught up to the vehicle as it turned onto Patsy. I activated my emergency lights and stopped the vehicle at Patsy and Laura. I exited my patrol vehicle and made contact with Victor De La Cerda Jr. (H/M, DOB xxxxxxxx) from his verbal statement. Victor stated that he had a California license but didn't have it on him and did not know the number. I returned to my patrol vehicle and ran Victor through the MCSO database. I confirmed that Victor did not have a driver's license through Texas at the time of the stop. I was further advised by MCSO Dispatch that they were not able to locate a license on Victor out of California. MCSO Dispatch was advised and asked for a fifteen-minute wrecker call. While waiting for the time to expire, I issued Victor an Oak Ridge North citation #41725 for Fail to Obtain DL and Display Expired License Plates.

Victor's vehicle was towed by A Plus Towing, chip #334, to 6317 Big Oaks, Conroe, TX in good condition.

On 11/29/2018 at approximately 0349 hours I, Officer Durham (Unit 2728), was notified of a suspicious vehicle at 427 Laura Lane by MCSO Dispatch. The caller advised that two males were in a white truck parked between his driveway and his neighbor's driveway. He advised Dispatch that he walked down his driveway and observed a white male walk from between his neighbor's vehicles. The white male enters the passenger side of the truck and the truck drove away. I arrived on the scene and my investigation revealed the following.

The reportee was standing in his driveway and identified himself as Youssouf Toure (B/M; DOB xxxxxxxx) by his TX DL #xxxxxxx. Youssouf stated his son woke him up crying around 0335 hours. He checked on his son and when he returned to the master bedroom, he observed that the motion flood light on the garage that pointed to the driveway was on. Youssouf stated this light can only be activated if someone walked on the driveway in front of the garage. Youssouf proceeded to look out of the window and observed the dimmed headlights of a truck parked between his driveway and his neighbor's driveway, located at 426 Laura Lane. Youssouf stated he went out the back door and through the back gate that leads to the driveway. It was at this time that he observed an individual rushing back to the passenger side of a white double cab pickup truck. Youssouf stated as soon as his gate slammed shut, the truck immediately began to drive away. Youssouf stated he could barely see the driver and moved closer toward the end of his driveway for a better look. He stated he was going to get the LP # of the truck but observed that it had been covered in a plastic wrap making it impossible to see. Youssouf stated the truck drove west on Laura Lane. He then called the Police for assistance.

Youssouf and I checked his vehicles for any damage or missing items. Youssouf's vehicles were secure and nothing was missing. I checked Youssouf's neighbor's vehicles and observed that their black Chevrolet Tahoe, TX LP #xxxxxxx, had an open driver's side door. I made contact with Youssouf's neighbors at 426 Laura Lane. Edgar Lira (H/M;

DOB xxxxx) and Jacquelyn Jaramillo (H/F; DOB xxxxxx) both identified themselves by their names and DOB. Both Lira and Jaramillo checked their vehicles and stated nothing had been taken from either of their vehicles, including the vehicle with the open door.

I asked Youssouf to complete a voluntary statement form and it has been submitted with this report. Currently, the suspects are unknown.

On 11/28/2018 at approximately 1132 hours I, Officer Stafford (Unit 2723), observed a black Chevrolet Silverado, bearing Texas license plate xxxxxx, southbound in the 26900 block of the IH 45 S Feeder. I ran the license plate and noticed that the registered owner, a Jesse Stevenson, had an active warrant out of Montgomery County for Possession of Marijuana. I was able to tell that the registered owner was the driver from a previous booking photo. I was able to catch up to the vehicle at 26415 IH 45 South Feeder. I activated my emergency lights and stopped the vehicle in the parking lot of a business at the above address. I exited my patrol vehicle and made contact with the driver, identified as Jesse Mathew Stevenson (W/M, DOB xxxxxxxx) from his Texas driver's license. I returned to my patrol vehicle and had MCSO dispatch confirm the active warrant on Jesse. The active warrant was out of Montgomery County Court of Law 5 for Possession of Marijuana < 2OZ - #17-324655. While waiting for confirmation, I issued Jesse an Oak Ridge North citation, #41733, for Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, as I found a small amount of marijuana that was not a usable amount. Dispatch confirmed the warrant. Jesse was placed under arrest and placed into the rear seat of my patrol vehicle. Jesse was transported to the MCSO South County Jail without any further incident. The vehicle was released to Jesse's boss, identified as Todd Allen Richardson (W/M, DOB xxxxxx) from his Texas driver's license. Due to the marijuana being an unusable amount, Jesse signed a destruction affidavit. The marijuana

was destroyed by placing it on the ground and rubbing it into ground with his foot. Before destroying the marijuana, it was tested using a NIK test kit and had a positive test result for marijuana.

On 11/29/2018 at approximately 1222 hours I, Officer Teske, observed a white Chevrolet Silverado, displaying TX LP # xxxxxxxx, traveling S/B on Harlan from Pyeatt. A check of the license plate on my MDT showed the registration expired September 2016 and the insurance showed Check Manually. I stopped the vehicle on Kane, west of Harlan. The driver was identified by TX ID card # xxxxxx as Jay Lamar French (W/M; DOB: xxxxxxxx). A check on my MDT and with MCSO Dispatch showed that French had a Texas Driver's License (#xxxxxx) that was Not Eligible due to the following:

French had previous convictions for Driving While License Invalid:

Due to the active suspension(s) and the previous conviction(s), French was arrested for the offense of Driving While License Invalid - enhanced with previous conviction. The vehicle was left on scene at his request. I transported French to the MCSO South County Jail for booking. French was issued ORNPD citation 169670 for the offenses of Expired Registration and No Insurance.

On 11/30/18 at approximately 1540 hours I, Officer Kennerly, was monitoring the radio when I heard Shenandoah PD advised they just had a theft in progress, located at 19103 IH 45 North, Home Depot. They gave a description of a heavy-set black male running to get in a black Jeep Cherokee with chrome rims and a temporary paper tag. The driver was said to be a white female. The vehicle left out of the store traveling northbound on the Feeder Road. I posted up at the on ramp at IH 45 South and Sawdust, hoping they would come back south.

Shortly after, I observed a black Jeep Cherokee pass by me. I could not see what kind of plate was on the vehicle, due to heavy traffic. I attempted to catch up with the vehicle and finally did catch up around the Hardy Toll Road overpass, still traveling south on the IH 45 main lanes. I confirmed the vehicle had a paper tag and observed two occupants in the vehicle but could not identify them at the time. Because the vehicle matched the description of the theft suspect's vehicle, I initiated a traffic stop. We stopped right at the 70A exit for FM 2920. I approached the vehicle with my weapon drawn but by my side and made contact with the driver, later identified as Natasha Hamalian, white female, date of birth xxxxxx. The passenger was identified as Nicholas Madison, black male, date of birth xxxxxx. While speaking with them, I observed a Bosch box and Dewalt box on the back seat. At this time, I did not know what was taken from Home Depot but since those items are sold there, I had Hamalian exit the vehicle first and advised Madison to keep his hands on the dashboard while I detained her. I then detained Madison. I asked them if they had just left Home Depot and Madison advised "Yes". He even admitted to attempting to take a vacuum from the store but when confronted by lost prevention, he dropped the vacuum and ran to his vehicle. Hamalian advised the boxes in the back were from Lowe's and she has a receipt for those items. I advised Shenandoah and Shenandoah PD Officer Langston (2843) made the scene. Officer Langston took custody of both Hamalian and Madison, and had the vehicle towed back to the scene at Home Depot.

On 12-01-2018 the Harris County Jail called and advised that Kevin Andre Herron Jr. (b/m; dob xxxxxx) was ready to be picked up. I, Sgt. Barry, confirmed Oak Ridge North Municipal Court had 2 active warrants for no proof of financial responsibility - UVFR - warrant #52019901, fine \$468.00 and failure to appear/bail jumping - warrant #520199F01, fine #348.00. The total fine amount is \$816.00. I took custody of Herron at the Harris County Jail, 1201 Commerce St., Houston, Texas. Herron was transported to the South Montgomery County Jail. While out at the jail, Montgomery County Dispatch advised Herron had an active warrant out of Montgomery County Court #5 for

Capias Pro Fine; original charge DWLI with previous conviction. Herron was booked into the jail on all warrants. Sgt. Nation was advised of the arrest.

On 12/01/18 at approximately 1455 hours I, Officer Kennerly, was advised by Montgomery County Precinct 3 Deputy Swetnam (8361) that he was out on Brittany Bigbee, white female, date of birth xxxxxx. Bigbee was showing to have Oak Ridge North warrants. I confirmed the following warrants: number 243558 02 for Driving While License Invalid, with a fine amount of \$154.26 and number 243558F 01 for Failure To Appear/Bail Jumping, with a fine amount of \$373.00. The total fine amount is \$527.26. I met Deputy Swetnam at 27500 IH 45 North Feeder, in the Office Depot parking lot, and served the warrants on Bigbee. Deputy Swetnam had other charges on Bigbee and took the Oak Ridge North warrants with him to include in his arrest report.

On 12/02/2018 at 1818 hours I, Officer Young, responded to an animal control call at 214 Hillside Ct. I arrived on scene and made contact with ORNPD Officer Kennerly (2720). Officer Kennerly advised that a witness identified as Evelina Moore (W/F; DOB xxxxxx) said that she observed two dogs attacking another dog in the ditch near 214 Hillside Ct. She went out to check on the dog that was attacked and said that the two dogs that attacked the one still in the ditch returned to the back-yard belonging to 214 Hillside Ct. Another resident identified as Roberta Williams (W/F; DOB unknown) also came to check on the dog. The dog had some bites marks but was unable to stand or walk. Officer Kennerly advised Dispatch to contact animal control to pick up the dog, as the dog had no collar. Animal control advised they would not come pick up the dog. Roberta advised she would take possession of the dog and transport it to the veterinarian to be evaluated. At about 2030 hours, Roberta called the city cell phone and advised that she and the veterinarian decided to have the dog put down. Roberta also advised that the dog would be cremated and that she would take possession of the ashes in case anyone came looking for

the dog at a later date. About half an hour passed and it was discovered that he dog belonged to a resident across the street from 214 Hillside Ct. Roberta spoke to the dog's owner and they were made aware of the incident that occurred and that a report was made.

On 12/02/2018 at approximately 0323 hours I, Officer Young, was contacted by Dispatch to confirm a warrant. Roman Forest Officer Smith (3911) made contact with a male, identified by TX DL # xxxxxxxx as James Owens (W/M; DOB xxxxxx). Officer Smith advised that when he checked James through his MDT, James showed to have active warrants through the Oak Ridge North PD. I arrived at the Oak Ridge North PD and confirmed that James had 5 active warrants through the Oak Ridge North Municipal Court. The warrants that were confirmed showed to be:

Warrant # 806006F01 - FAILURE TO APPEAR/ BOND JUMPING - Fine Amount \$348.00

Total Fine Amount \$1,587.00

Roman Forest PD had James' vehicle towed. James was unable to pay restitution and was taken into custody. James was transported to the MCSO Main Jail in Conroe but was denied due to medical issues. I transported James to Conroe Regional for a medical evaluation. ORNPD Officer Kennerly (2720) relieved me at the hospital, took custody of James, and transported him to male booking when James was medically cleared by the hospital.

On 12/03/2018 at approximately 1902 hours I, Officer Durham (Unit 2728), was dispatched to a suspicious person call at the Quik Serv, located at 27328 Woodson Road. MCSO Dispatch advised that the suspicious person was a W/M standing near the front entrance of the store. I arrived on scene and observed a W/M, in a brown hoodie and dark sweat pants, standing in front of the entrance door of Quik Serv. My investigation revealed the following.

The white male was standing in front of the left main entrance door. The Quik Serv clerk, Cristo Fernandes (H/M; DOB xxxxxxxx), had asked the white male to leave the property before my arrival. I approached the male and asked for this name and DOB. He advised that he was waiting for family and that we are all family. I then asked for his name again and he refused to speak. He advised me that he had to stand in front of the door of Quik Serv for fifty years. I again asked for his name and he stated his name was Tim but refused to give a last name or DOB. I advised him he could not stay on location and advised him to leave. I left the premises and went back in service.

At approximately 1953 hours, I was notified by MCSO Dispatch that the male had not left the scene. MCSO Dispatch had received another suspicious person call stating the white male had continued to stand in front of Quik Serv's front door despite being advised numerous times by Fernandes to leave. I arrived on scene and observed Tim standing in front of the entrance door. I asked him to move away from the door. Tim stated he would not move from his location. I made contact with the clerk of Quik Serv, Fernandes, who stated a customer knew where Tim lived. Fernandes gave me that address (411 Springwood Dr., Conroe, TX 77385). Sgt. Straight arrived on scene and drove to the address. Sgt. Straight made contact with Tim's father, Ron Waldbillig (W/M; DOB xxxxxxxx), who gave Tim's full name as Tim Waldbillig (W/M; DOB xxxxxxxx). Ron advised that Tim had stopped taking his psychiatric medication over a month ago. Ron advised Sgt. Straight that he was afraid for his well-being because of his son's condition. I contacted ADA Intake Andrew, who advised me they would accept the charge of Criminal Trespass against Tim. Due to being asked to leave the property many times by Fernandes, Sgt. Straight, and myself, Tim was arrested for Criminal Trespass. He was transported to the MCSO Jail for booking without incident.

I asked Fernandes to complete a voluntary statement form. The form has been submitted with this report.

On 12/03/18, the Honorable Lisa Michalk (9th District Court Judge) issued an arrest warrant (#18-12-15853) for Alexander Vita (Defendant), for Injury To A Child (3rd degree felony), in reference to case # 18P006259/12775.

On 12/04/18 at about 7:20 am, Lt. Hubbard (2702), Sgt. Nation (2705), and I (Detective B. Rogers, 2715), responded to 59 N. Veilwood Circle, The Woodlands, TX 77382 (Defendant's residence) to arrest him on the outstanding arrest warrant. We made contact with Defendant's mother at the front door and she summoned Defendant from his bedroom. We made contact with Defendant, confirmed the warrant through MCSO Dispatch, and I then took him into custody for the outstanding warrant at about 7:35 am. I transported Defendant to the South County MCSO Jail without further incident. Defendant was then remanded to the jail staff and booked for the warrant. I cleared this call at about 8:26 am. End of narrative.

On 12/03/18 at approximately 14:20 hours, Lt. Hubbard and I, Sgt. Nation checked out at 55 Summer Crest Circle Spring, TX. in reference to a warrant service on Michael Paul Garbis w/m, dob: xxxxxxxx. I made contact with Mr. Garbis's roommate at the front door of their residence. The roommate allowed us inside the residence, where I made contact with Mr. Garbis sitting in the living room. Mr. Garbis identified himself to me by TDL # xxxxxxxx to be the defendant. Mr. Garbis was detained, Montgomery County Communications confirmed the following Felony Warrant: #18-11-15075 Theft (\$1,500 Bond). We transported Mr. Garbis to the Montgomery County Jail. Upon our arrival

to the jail, I booked him in on the Felony Warrant and he was released to jail staff without incident.

On 12-03-2018 at approximately 1723 hours, I, Officer Teske, was advised by MCSO Dispatch of a warrant service call at 29503 Evergreen Hills Drive. Dispatch advised that MCO Pct 3 Deputy Constable Swetnum (#8361) was currently out on Cristian Santa-Maria (W/M; DOB: xxxxxxx) and Cristian was showing active warrants through the Oak Ridge North Municipal Court. I confirmed the following warrants on Cristian:

Warrant #5205101 for Speeding 70 MPH in a 45 MPH Zone (\$312.00).

Warrant #5205102 for Expired Registration (\$266.00).

Warrant #52051V01 for Violate Promise to Appear (\$374.00).

The total fine amount was \$952.00.

Deputy Swetnum placed Cristian under arrest for the warrants and then met with me at IFly located in the 26800 block of the IH 45 North Feeder Road. I took custody of Cristian and transported him to the MCSO South County Jail for booking.

On 12-02-2018 at approx. 2120 hours Montgomery County Dispatch advised of a trespassing past at 26723 Hillside Dr. Officer Richard and Officer Young arrived and met the complainant in the driveway of 26723 Hillside Dr. The complainant was identified as Daniel Cole Easton (w/m; dob xxxxxxx). I, Sgt. Barry, arrived at approx. 2122 hours. Easton advised his brother in law (Kevin) who lives behind him, came into his backyard. Easton wanted to show us where the trespassing happened, and we followed him into the backyard. Once in the back yard I noticed there was not a fence and no obvious property lines. I did see private property signs located on trees in the back yard. Easton stated that while he was in the backyard Kevin walked

onto his property and challenged him to a fight. Easton pointed to a spot to where he stated Kevin entered his property and that area was approx. 2-4 feet into his property according to where Easton advised the property line was. Easton advised in 2013 his sister advised their Mother that their brother was a pedophile. Easton advised that his brother was not a pedophile and he had remained upset at his sister and others for saying something false about his brother. Easton advised his brother went downhill after they started talking about him like that. Easton advised the other night he sent all 6 of them text messages about the accusations involving his brother.

I advised Easton that we would go over to his Sisters house and advise them not to come onto his property. Easton stated he would go with us. I advised Easton that he was upset, and it would be best for us to go without him. Easton became more upset and started raising his voice and saying we were taking their side. Easton stated it was a free country and he can go over there if he wanted to. I advised him that he called us to help him and that is all we were trying to do, but I cannot let him go over to his sister's house. Easton advised that he must go to make sure that I do my job. I then started to leave to go talk with his sister and Easton ran after me yelling that I was not doing my job and asked for all Officers names and stated he was going over my head. I advised that is fine and we left.

We went over to his sister's house 27811 Maplewood Dr. I made contact with Easton's sister who advised that she owns the house that Easton lives in at 26723 Hillside Dr. and that she has the deed to the house. She advised that Easton was bipolar along with other mental problems. I asked if she could ask Kevin to come outside. She advised that Kevin was intoxicated but asked him to come outside. When Kevin came out, I asked Kevin if he was outside and had a problem with Easton. Kevin advised he was outside, and Easton started to yell at him. Kevin advised Easton told him to hit him several times. Kevin stated he did not fight Easton and returned inside his house. I asked Kevin if he went onto Easton's property. Kevin advised he did not. I advised both Kevin and his wife that Easton does not want them on his property and is willing to file charges of trespassing if they do. She again brought up that she has the deed to the house and I advised that would have to be worked out in the courts. I advised that as long as he was the one living in the house that I would have to listen to him as

who was allowed on the property. The sister wanted to complain about Easton's dog that he allows to come onto their property. I asked them if that was a problem that they want to get into with someone they told me was mentally unstable. I then advised if they have a problem contact the Police Department. While talking to them Kevin had urinated on himself.

On 12/05/2018 at approximately 1807 hours I, Officer Young, was Dispatched to a shots fired call at 26710 Westwood Drive. I arrived at the residence and observed three adult males laying in the drive way fighting, there was a fourth male standing near the three males laying on the ground. There was also a female standing in the drive way of the residence. The victim was identified as Zachary Nanni (W/M; DOB xxxxxxxx), the second male was identified as Ronald Nanni (W/M; DOB xxxxxxxx). The third male, whom was the actor, was identified as Michael Dominguez (W/M; DOB xxxxxxxx). The male that was standing near the incident was identified as Sidney Parlour (W/M; DOB xxxxxxxx). The female witness was identified as Jodi Nanni (W/F; DOB xxxxxxxx). When I approached the males laying on the ground, I observed a Ruger pistol laying south of the men on the concrete driveway near the grass. After detaining all the males. Sidney advised that he lives next door and heard gun shots, he arrived with his handgun and observed the three males on the ground, Sidney advised that he saw a gun on the ground next to the men fighting and kicked it away from everybody. Zachary and Ronald stated that the pistol belonged to Michael and that Michael discharged the firearm. Michael confirmed that the pistol was his and that he did discharge the firearm. Michael was escorted to my patrol vehicle, where ORNPD Sgt. Barry (2703) removed all personal items so we could place him in the rear seat of the patrol car. During this process Sgt. Barry located in the front right pocket of Michael's pants, three vape cartridges. The cartridges were incased in black containers labeled as containing THC oil. Michael was asked what happened that the police were called. Michael stated that Zachary owed him one hundred dollars. Michael decided to come to Zachary's residence with a gun and get some form

of payment. Michael arrived at the residence and decided to go into the garage where Zachary usually hangs out. Michael entered the garage and found three of the THC vape cartridges that Michael stated were approximately forty dollars in value each. Michael took three of them from the garage and placed them in his pocket. Three of the vials covered the amount Zachary owed him. Michael stated that there were more drugs in the garage and just took what he was owed. When Michael exited the garage, Zachary was standing out on the back patio. Michael had the gun in his hand and aimed it at Zachary, giving Zachary the command not to move. Michael then ran back down the drive way. Zachary and his father began to chase after Michael. Michael turned around and fired one to two shots in the air. One casing was recovered at the scene. The casing was located on the driveway in the area where they said the shot(s) were fired. Michael was taken to the ground by Zachary and Ronald and held there until police arrived. Voluntary statements were provided by all parties involved and are transcribed at the bottom of this report.

I contacted the On call ADA, she accepted the charge of Aggravated Robbery on Michael. The Firearm Michael had was a Ruger LCP II 38 caliber displaying serial #xxxxxxx. The firearm was run through Dispatch and showed not to be stolen. The firearm, the recovered casing, and other property were taken to the Oak Ridge North PD and placed into evidence. All photos of the scene were uploaded to the case file. Michael was transported to Memorial Hermann to be evaluated by medical professionals, as he had some bruises and a small cut near his ear.

We asked for consent to search the garage for additional narcotics. Jodi Nanni gave ORNPD written consent to enter the garage and search for narcotics. Upon entering the garage, it was observed that there were multiple vials matching the ones found in Michael's pocket laying on the coffee table, the desk and the tv stand. All the vials were empty. Behind the TV stand we found a clear glass bong used to smoke marijuana. On the coffee table there was a clear plastic bag containing a green leafy substance. Also on the coffee table was a clear cup that contained more of the green leafy substance. I know through my training and experience as a Texas Peace Officer that the green leafy substance was marijuana. When Zachary was asked about the Marijuana, Zachary stated that it was marijuana and that it

belonged to him. Zachary advised that he was a smoker and that it doesn't hurt anyone. The green leafy substance tested positive for marijuana using a NIK field test kit.

The on call ADA was contacted about the Marijuana and she accepted the charge of POM <2oz on Zachary. The total weight of the Marijuana that was found was approximately 9.5grams. Zachary was placed into custody and transported to MCSO South County Jail for booking. All Marijuana and vials matching the ones found on Michael were taken the Oak Ridge North PD and placed into evidence. All photos were updated to the case file.

After booking Zachary into the MCSO South County Jail, I went to meet Sgt. Barry at Memorial Hermann where I took custody of Michael and transported him to the Oak Ridge North PD. While at the Oak Ridge North PD, Lt Hubbard conducted an interview with Michael about the events that took place that evening. Once Lt. Hubbard finished his interview. I transported Michael to MCSO Main Jail and booked him.
