

POLICE ACTIVITY REPORT DEC 17 TO JAN 02, 2019

On 12/18/2018 at approximately 0950 hours, Officer Stafford conducted a traffic stop on a gray 2012 Chevrolet Equinox, displaying TX LP # xxxxxxxx, for expired registration (November 2018). He stopped the vehicle in the 27300 block of Woodson Rd. Officer Stafford requested that I, Officer Jared Young, back him up on the traffic stop. When I arrived on scene, I made contact with Officer Stafford who advised me that the driver, who was identified by TDL # xxxxxxxx as Robert Davis (W/M; DOB xxxxxxxx), was operating a motor vehicle with expired registration, a suspended license, and no insurance. I checked Davis's TDL on my MDT and with MCSO Dispatch and determined that his license was currently suspended. The TDL has been two suspensions for Default Installment Agreement for No Insurance. The dates for those suspensions started on 06/08/2018 and 08/13/2018. There is a third suspension for Surcharge Due for No Insurance with a starting date of 11/15/2018. Due to the active suspensions and no liability insurance, I placed Davis under arrest for Driving While License Invalid - enhanced with no insurance.

I asked Davis if there was anything that I needed to be aware of that was on his person or in the motor vehicle. Davis stated that he had a pipe in his left pocket. I retrieved a glass pipe from his front left pocket that contained a white powdery substance. I believed the substance to be methamphetamine, through my training and experience as a Texas Certified Peace Officer. Officer Teske field tested a sample of the white powdery substance using an NIC Test kit and the substance tested positive for methamphetamine.

Davis explained the pipe was his and he had smoked as recently as this morning. Officer Stafford conducted a search of the motor vehicle and discovered a silver colored .357 Magnum Ruger SP101 revolver, serial #xxxxxxx, in the center console. I had Dispatch check the serial number of the firearm for the possibility that it might be stolen. Dispatch ran a check on the pistol and advised the gun was entered stolen through MCSO. The firearm was reported stolen on 06/21/2015 through MCSO with case #15A010044, with NIC # G633512841. I read Davis the Miranda Warning and he stated that he understood his rights and agreed to speak to me. Davis advised that he got the firearm from his uncle, Wade Jones. He stated his uncle lives in Willis, but he did not know any other information. He stated that Jones gave him the weapon for his protection because he worked in a bad area of La Porte. I contacted ADA Brittany with the Montgomery County DA's Office and she accepted charges of DWLI, Unlawful Carrying of a Firearm, and Possession of a Controlled Substance, PG 1, less than one gram. I transported Davis to the ORNPD where he met with Detective Rogers. Detective Rogers questioned him about the stolen pistol and Davis told him that he did not know the pistol was stolen and that his uncle gave it to him. I then transported Davis to the MCSO South County Jail for booking. The vehicle was towed by Keith's Towing and was stored at 27714 Robinson Road. Davis was issued ORNPD citation # 41772 for the offense of Expired Registration and citation # 72792 for the offense of No Insurance. I transported the pistol and the methamphetamine to the ORNPD. The pistol was turned into the evidence room at the ORNPD. I weighed the pipe with methamphetamine residue using an Ohaus Dial O Gram scale. The total weight of the

pipe and methamphetamine was 6.1 grams. Although the total weight was 6.1 grams, Davis was charged with Possession of a Controlled Substance, less than one gram, as there was most likely less than a gram of methamphetamine inside the pipe. The pipe was placed into evidence at the ORNPD.

A copy of this report was sent to MCSO Dispatch, so the pistol could be removed from NCIC/TCIC as stolen.

The pistol was removed from NCIC/TCIC on 12/18/2018 at 1129 hours by Z1026/Pady with NIC # G633512841.

On 12/18/2018 at approximately 1100 hours I, Officer Stafford (Unit 2723), was dispatched for a warrant service to confirm warrants on Trey Alan McCurley, W/M, DOB xxxxxx. After arriving at the PD, I located two active ORN warrants on Trey. The warrants were for No Proof of Financial Responsibility - #110024501, fine \$658.40 and Failure to Appear - #1100245F01, fine \$502.40. The total fine amount for the active warrants is \$1,160.80. After locating the warrants, I met Deputy Lackey (6P1003) at the South County Jail and took custody of Trey.

I asked Trey if he was able to pay the fines and he stated that he could not. I placed Trey under arrest and booked him into the MCSO South County jail without incident. Trey was initially stopped for walking in the roadway by Deputy Lackey.

On 12/19/18 at approximately 1740 hours I, Officer Kennerly, was advised by Montgomery County Dispatch that Montgomery County Sheriff's Lieutenant Fitzgerald (6P10) was out on Claudia Richo, white female, date of birth xxxxxx. Richo was showing to have Oak Ridge North warrants. I confirmed the following capias warrant number 1100531 03 for No Proof of Financial Responsibility, with a fine amount of \$346.00. I made Lt. Fitzgerald's location and spoke with Richo. I advised her that she had an outstanding warrant through Oak Ridge North and asked her if she could make restitution today. Richo advised she could, so I placed her in custody and transported her to the Oak Ridge North Police Department. Richo paid the whole fine amount on-line and received confirmation number 924MLA. I allowed Richo to leave her vehicle on the shoulder of the roadway while she came with me to the Police Department. After making restitution, she was transported back to her vehicle by Oak Ridge North Sergeant Barry.

On Thursday, 12/20/18, I, Detective James Kipness, Jr. of the ORNPD, arrived at Montgomery County CJR in reference to a warrant service. Deandre Charles Williams, B/M, DOB xxxxx, was already in custody at the Montgomery County Jail on other charges. I served the following three Oak Ridge North municipal warrants: Expired Registration - #520387, fine \$236.00; No Driver's License - #52038702, fine \$209.00; and FTA/Bail Jumping - #520387F01, fine \$318.00. The total fine amount was \$763.00. End of narrative.

On 12/21/2018 at around 1230 hours I, Officer Stafford (Unit 2723), was dispatched to a motor vehicle accident that occurred in the area of the 26500 block of the IH 45 North Freeway. I was further advised by Montgomery County Sheriff's Dispatcher that one of the vehicles had left the scene and the other vehicle followed trying to get the license plate. In addition, one of the parties involved stopped at Bank of America, located at 1201 Lake Woodlands.

Upon arriving at Bank of America, I met with Vicente Dario Hernandez (H/M, DOB xxxxxx) from his Texas driver's license. Vicente advised that he was stopped in traffic on IH 45 North trying to exit at Woodlands Parkway when a black Chevrolet Monte Carlo, bearing Texas license plate xxxxx, sideswiped him and left the scene. Vicente further stated that he followed the vehicle off the freeway, onto the service road, and turned onto Lake Woodlands. Both vehicles then turned into the mall at the stop sign for the ring road. Vicente said that the male driver of the other vehicle pointed a gun at him. Vicente said that after seeing the male point a gun at him, he turned off, pulled into the parking lot of Bank of America, and called MCSO Dispatch. I asked if he could provide a description of the male and the car. He stated the following: the male was a black male, wearing a red baseball cap. The car was described as a black Chevrolet, unknown make, with a Texas license plate of xxxxxx. Vicente was also able to see that a yellow sticker was in the back windshield of the vehicle. Vicente then said that a black female was also in the car in the passenger's seat, but he was not able to provide a description of her.

The license plate provided by Vicente comes back to a black 2001 Chevrolet Monte Carlo coupe, with a registered owner of Patricia Theresa Simmons who lives at xxxxxxxxxx. After speaking with Vicente, I advised him that I would work the accident and provided him a case number. I then called MCSO and had a Deputy stop by to complete the report of the gun being pointed at him. The case number for the Sheriff's Department is 18A371984. See ORNPD accident report # 18P008866 for details regarding the crash.

On 12/21/2018 at approximately 1523 hours I, Officer Stafford (Unit 2723), observed a black Chrysler Sebring, bearing Texas temporary tag xxxxxxxx, that appeared to be on fire in the 26500 block of the IH 45 S Freeway on the inside shoulder. When I arrived, Officer Teske (Unit 2712) was already on scene speaking with the driver. The driver was identified as Eugene Earl Armstrong Jr. (B/M, DOB xxxxxxxx) from his Texas Identification card. I ran Eugene through the MCSO database and discovered that he had active warrants through Oak Ridge North. I returned to my patrol vehicle and called Detective Kipness, with Oak Ridge North, to confirm the active warrants. The three active warrants were for Expired Registration - #6947601, fine \$269.00; Driving While License Invalid - #6947602, fine \$344.00; and Failure to Appear - #69476F01, fine \$339.00. Total fines due \$952.00. Eugene was asked if he could if was able to pay the fines. He stated that he could not, was placed under arrest, and placed into the rear seat of my

patrol vehicle. Eugene was transported to the MCSO South County Jail without any further incident. The vehicle was towed by Harshaw Towing to 6321 Big Oaks. The vehicle had a hold placed on it as it had an altered VIN plate on the dash. MCSO Auto Theft was notified to further investigate, per Officer Teske.

On 12/21/2018 at approximately 2358 hours, Officer Langston (SPD) made contact with Terry Jefferson (B/M; DOB xxxxxxxx). Officer Langston had stopped Jefferson at the Red Lobster, located at 18446 IH 45 S Feeder Road. Jefferson showed to have a warrant out of the Oak Ridge North Municipal Court. Officer Langston asked the ORN Police to confirm the warrant. I, Officer Durham, found one active Oak Ridge North Municipal Court warrant for the following:

**Warrant #80427901 - Fail to Maintain Financial Responsibility - Fine \$368.00
Total Fine Amount: \$368.00**

I arrived on scene and asked Jefferson if he could pay for his fine amount of \$368.00. Jefferson advised he could pay the full fine amount. Jefferson paid the full fine amount of \$368.00 with a Western Union money order, #xxxxxxxx. Jefferson was released from the scene. I submitted the money order along with this report. I advised Sgt. Nation of the paid warrant.

On 12/21/2018 at approximately 1933 hours, Officer White (HPD) made contact with Roy Charles (B/M; DOB xxxxxxxx). Charles showed to have warrants out of the Oak Ridge North Municipal Court and a felony warrant out of Houston. Officer White called the ORN Police patrol phone to confirm the warrants. I, Officer Durham, found three active Oak Ridge North Municipal Court warrant for the following:

Warrant #5200012701 - Speeding 75 MPH in a 45 MPH zone - Fine \$327.00

Warrant #5200012702 - Driving While License Invalid - Fine \$326.00

Warrant #520001270 - Violate Promise to Appear - Fine \$374.00

Total Fine Amount: \$1,027.00

Officer White asked that I fax the warrants to him. I faxed the warrants to Officer White and received the fax machine confirmation page. I made attempts to contact Officer White to see if he had received the warrants but was unable to make further contact with Officer White.

Charles was arrested and transported to the HCSO Jail by Officer White where he was booked. I advised Sgt. Nation of the arrest.

On 12/22/2018 at approximately 0228 hours I, Officer Durham (Unit 2728), was sitting o the Woodlands Pkwy SE Loop. I observed a silver Mitsubishi Eclipse, bearing Texas license plate #xxxxxxx. A search on my MDT revealed that the Eclipse's registration expired 10/2017. I activated my emergency lights and stopped the vehicle in the 27900 block

of the IH 45 North Feeder. My investigation revealed the following.

I observed one occupant in the Eclipse. The driver identified herself as Heather Reed (W/F; DOB xxxxxxx) by her TX ID #37065615. I asked for her driver's license and insurance information. Reed did not have proof of insurance or her driver's license.

A search on my MDT revealed Reed had a TX DL, #xxxxxxx. My MDT also revealed that Reed had two local warrants from Oak Ridge North Municipal Court. I was able to confirm on two warrants and they are as follows:

Warrant #1694069801 - Speeding - Fine \$266.00

Warrant #16900823F1 - Failure to Appear / Bail Jumping - Fine \$348.00

Total Fine Amount: \$614.00

Reed was unable to pay the total fine amount of \$614.00.

Reed was arrested and placed in my patrol car.

I asked MCSO Dispatch for a fifteen-minute ORN wrecker call. While waiting for the time to expire, I issued Reed an Oak Ridge North citation #11001551 for Expired Registration and Fail to Maintain Financial Responsibility.

The Eclipse was towed by South County Towing to 28075 Robinson Road in poor condition.

Reed was transported to MCSO Jail for booking without incident.

On 12/22/2018 at approximately 1545 hours I, Officer Stafford (Unit 2723), was dispatched for a warrant service to confirm warrants on Esmeralda Benavides, H/F, DOB xxxxxx.

After arriving at the PD, I located six active ORN warrants on Esmeralda. The warrants were for: Speeding 80 MPH in a 45 MPH - #20083341, fine \$475.10; Driving While License Invalid - #20083342, fine \$432.20; Failed to Yield ROW to Emergency Vehicle - #20083343, fine \$410.10; Violate Promise to Appear - #20085565, fine \$468.60; Failure to Appear - #901446VF01, fine \$464.70; and Failure to Appear - #901446VFF1, fine \$502.40 The total fine amount for the active warrants is \$2,753.10. After locating the warrants, I met Deputy C. Arnold, (6P1047) with Montgomery County Sheriff Department, at 1201 Lake Woodlands at Dillards. I asked Esmeralda if she was able to pay the fines and she stated that he could not. Deputy C. Arnold placed Esmeralda under arrest and transported her to the MCSO female booking, without incident, for the active warrants and felony theft.

On 12/22/2018 at approximately 1344 hours I, Officer Teske, responded to the area of 9664 Rhodes Rd in reference to a shooting call. Officer Jared Young was riding with me. We arrived on scene and met with Shenandoah PD Sgt. Pullen (#2820). She was standing next to a silver Kia SUV, displaying TX LP # xxxxxxxx, that had crashed into the ditch on the south side of Rhodes, at the intersection with Pierson St. She advised the male sitting in the driver's seat had been shot in the right side (rib cage). Officer Young assisted MCHD Medics in removing the driver, later identified as Eric Thomas (B/M; DOB xxxxxxxx), from the vehicle and placing him onto a stretcher. MCHD Medic 22 then transported Thomas to Memorial Hermann The Woodlands. Officer

Young and I then assisted in securing the scene and setting up crime scene tape for MCSO Deputies. Officer Young and I walked north on Pierson Street with an unknown State Trooper. The Trooper located a black Taurus semi-automatic 9mm pistol laying on the ground. The pistol was laying on the west side of Pierson, approximately 400 feet north of Rhodes Rd. There was a pile of shattered glass in the middle of the roadway near the pistol. The Trooper stayed on location, with the pistol, and we returned to service.

On Saturday,12/22/2018, at around 0403 hours I, Officer Valdez (2734), was dispatched to a welfare check at IH 45 North main lanes/Lake Woodlands. The welfare check was for a male who was passed out in his vehicle on the outside shoulder with his hazard lights on. I arrived on scene and made contact with the male. He was asleep in his vehicle, so I knocked on his driver's side window countless times but got no response. I opened the driver's side door and attempted to wake the male. The male eventually came to. I asked him how much he had to drink, and he asked me how much I had to drink. The male appeared to be very disoriented and did not make sense. I eventually identified the male by name and DOB as Jesus Hernandez Mejia, H/M, DOB xxxxxxxx. Mejia's eyes were blood shot red and glassy. He smelled like the odor of an alcoholic beverage and I observed vomit on his driver's side floorboard. I asked Mejia

to step out of the vehicle so that I could do some tests on him to determine whether he was safe to drive. When Mejia stepped out of the vehicle, he finally admitted to me that he had 6 beers. Mejia consented to all my Standardized Field Sobriety tests.

I am certified to administer the Standardized Field Sobriety Test including Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus. Prior to the testing Mejia stated that he did not wear glasses or contact lenses. He advised me that he had never received any major head injuries that would prevent him from having this test administered on him. He had equal pupil size and equal tracking in both eyes. Also note that I did not witness any resting Nystagmus in either eye prior to doing this test.

I then administered the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus Test on him. This test is a Standardized Field Sobriety Test that is used to detect Nystagmus when following a stimulus side to side. Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus is defined as an involuntary jerking of the eyes that occurs when there is a disturbance of the vestibular system or the oculomotor control of the eye. Alcohol and other certain central nervous system depressants, inhalants, and phencyclidine cause the presence of Nystagmus.

Upon administering this test, I observed the following clues of intoxication:

- * Lack of smooth pursuit (Both left & right eye).**
- * Distinct and Sustained Nystagmus at maximum deviation (Both left & right eye).**
- * Onset Nystagmus prior to 45 degrees (Both left & right eye).**

Note: There were a total of six clues observed in this test. I observed Nystagmus in both the left and the right eye during all the above steps. During the above-mentioned test

there could only be a total of six clues that could be possible.

I then provided instructions and demonstrated to him how to perform the Walk & Turn Test. The testing area was flat, dry, and clean of any major debris. This test is a divided attention Standardized Field Sobriety Test. I demonstrated and explained this test in its entirety making sure that he had no further questions prior to beginning. I advised him that he was not to stop once he began or until he felt that he was completely through with the test. Once he began the test, I witnessed him to take twenty-one steps in the forward advancement making an improper turn to the right. While walking the initial twenty-one steps of the instructed nine steps process, I witnessed him miss heel to toe, extend his arms more than 6" from his side using them for balance, and step off the line. Once he completed the turn to the right, I witnessed him return to the area in which he began the test, taking eleven steps to get there out of the initially instructed nine. Once again on the return portion of this test, I witnessed him miss heel to toe, extend his arms more than 6" from his side using them for balance, and step off the line. Upon him conducting this test, I observed the following clues of intoxication:

- * Steps off line.**
- * Uses arms to balance.**
- * Starts too soon**
- * Misses heel to toe.**
- * Wrong Number of Steps**
- * Improper Turn**

Note: There were six clues observed out a total number of eight clues that could be possible.

I then provided instructions and demonstrated to him how to perform the One Leg Stand Test. This test is a divided attention Standardized Field Sobriety Test. I demonstrated and explained this test in its entirety making sure that he had no further questions prior to beginning. I advised him that he was not to stop once he began or until I told him he was through with the test. I advised him that the test which he was about to perform was a timed test and took exactly 30 seconds to complete. I advised him that once he began the test, I would start the clock advising him when 30 seconds had lapsed. Once he began the test, I witnessed him lift his foot off the ground as instructed beginning the test. Upon him conducting this test, I observed the following clues of intoxication:

- * Sways while balancing.**
- * Puts foot down.**
- * Uses arms to balance.**

Note: There were three clues observed out of a total number of four clues that could be possible.

At about 0430 hours, upon Mejia completing the above tests, it was apparent that he did not have the normal mental use of his physical faculties by reason of the introduction of CNS depressants into his body. After totaling my clues, I found the driver to be intoxicated. I placed him under arrest for Driving While Intoxicated, an offense arising from Chapter 49.04 of the Texas Penal Code. He was eventually transported without incident to the South County Jail without further incident. I contacted the on-call ADA, Stewart, who advised me that she would accept charges against Mejia for Driving While Intoxicated.

Mejia was placed in my patrol vehicle and read the DIC-24 paperwork. He consented to providing me with a specimen of his blood.

The vehicle was inventoried and towed by Loveday Towing, chip #276, to 28075 Robinson Rd.

I transported Mejia to The Woodlands Memorial Herman Hospital for a blood draw. While there I met with RN Bates who drew blood from his left arm. I witnessed the blood draw take place at 0454 hours. I witnessed the nurse invert both tubes of blood several times prior to placing them into the kit. Both tubes were sealed with the provided integrity tape. All blood was collected and placed into the original kit which was submitted as evidence to the ORNPD evidence locker for processing.

While at the South County Jail upon further inspection of Mejia's property a small clear plastic bag with a white powdery substance was found in his wallet. The substance in the clear plastic bag was tested with a Nik test kit and the test showed the substance to be positive for cocaine. Mejia was charged with PCS PG1, < 1 gram. The cocaine was weighed at the South County Jail and the weight was .34 grams. The cocaine was seized and turned in to the ORNPD evidence locker.

A copy of all necessary DIC paperwork and the tow slip were put into the Arrestee's property bag for his records. The digital video from my in-car video system of the DWI interview was uploaded to the ORNPD server at the office. The original DIC 23, 24, and 25 were sent to the Department of Public Safety. Mejia did not have a TX DL due to be an undocumented alien so a license was not confiscated.

On Saturday, 12/22/2018, at approximately 0248 hours I, Officer Valdez, was patrolling near the 27000 block of the IH 45 North Feeder. I observed a black Ford pickup truck driving in front of me with expired paper plates (Dec 16, 2018). I turned on my red/blue emergency lights and stopped the vehicle in the 27900 block of the IH 45 North Feeder. I made contact with the driver and identified him by name and DOB as Mario Antonio Peraza, H/M, DOB xxxxxxxx. Peraza advised that he did not have a TX DL and he had no insurance. I aired for an ORNPD wrecker. I advised Peraza that his vehicle was being towed because he did not have insurance, did not have a DL, and his registration was expired. Peraza's vehicle was towed from the scene by Loveday Towing to 28075 Robinson Rd, by chip # 276. Peraza was also cited for No DL and No insurance and given a warning for the registration. The citation # is 520759. The tow slip was submitted to the ORNPD along with my report for further review.

On Saturday, 12/22/2018, at approximately 2335 hours I, Officer Valdez, was asked by MCSO 2 Dispatch to confirm a local ORNPD warrant that MCSO Sheriff's Deputy Henderson (6P1082) was out on. Deputy Henderson was out on Anthony Lee Falla, W/M, DOB xxxxxxxx. I drove to the ORNPD and confirmed four outstanding ORNPD warrants. I advised Dispatch and then met Deputy Henderson at 1395 Many Pines Rd. I made contact with Falla and offered him the

opportunity to make restitution. Falla advised that he did not have the funds to pay. I then placed Falla in custody and transported him to the Conroe Jail for the following warrants:

#5200093001 - Speeding 66 MPH in a 45 MPH Zone - Fine amount of \$350.00.

#5200093002 - No Proof of Financial Responsibility - UVFR - Fine amount of \$488.00.

#5200093003 - No Driver's License - Fine amount of \$259.00.

#52000930V1 - Violate Promise To Appear - Fine amount of \$394.00.

The total fine amount for the warrants is \$1,491.00.

The SID # for the warrants is 08506262.

Falla's vehicle was towed from the scene by Deputy Henderson.

Copies of the warrants along with the arrest report have been turned in to the ORNPD for further review.

On 12/22/2018 at approximately 0032 hours I, Officer Durham (2728), was patrolling southbound on the IH 45 S main lanes. As I approached the overpass of Research Forest Dr and Tamina Rd., I observed a gray Mini Cooper (TX LP #xxxxxxx) traveling in the outside lane on the IH 45 S main lanes. I noticed the driver travel over the solid white line and onto the shoulder just before the Lake Woodlands exit ramp by a significant amount. The driver then proceeded to cross the solid white line again drifting onto the shoulder and almost struck the barrier near the exit sign. The driver proceeded S/B in the outside lane of the IH 45 S main lanes. I observed the driver swerving in the lane. The driver then swerved into

the left lane and slowly drifted back onto the outside lane. I activated my emergency red/blue lights to perform a traffic stop on the vehicle. The driver of the Cooper continued for a couple more blocks before it stopped in the 27500 block of the IH 45 S main lanes outside shoulder. I approached the driver and asked the driver for her driver's license. I watched her fumble through the back of her phone case, aimlessly looking for her driver's license. Her eyes were bloodshot and glassy, and her speech was slurred. She handed me a TX DL #xxxxxxx and identified herself as Paola Ovideo Trujillo (H/F; DOB xxxxxxx). Knowing Shenandoah PD's DWI task force was currently on duty and the incident took place in Shenandoah, I contacted Officer J. Ledesma (2832) and advised him of the stop. Officer Ledesma arrived on scene and made contact with Trujillo. Officer Ledesma then moved the scene to Ashley Furniture, located at 25415 IH 45 S Feeder Road, to perform SFSTs. I arrived to assist Officer Ledesma with the scene. Upon Trujillo completing the SFSTs, Officer Ledesma found it was apparent that she did not have the normal use of her mental or physical faculties by reason of the introduction of CNS Depressants into her body. Officer Ledesma placed Trujillo under arrest for Driving While Intoxicated, an offense arising from Chapter 49.04 of the Texas Penal Code. Trujillo was placed in Officer Ledesma's patrol vehicle and read the DIC-24 paperwork. I then left the scene. I am submitting this report as a supplement to Officer Ledesma's report for the arrest of Trujillo.

On 12/23/22018 at approximately 0700 hours I, Officer Jared Young, observed a suspicious vehicle in the 26600 block of the IH-45 North Feeder Rd. The motor vehicle was a blue 2005 Chevrolet Silverado, displaying Texas Temporary Tag xxxxxxx. I observed the motor vehicle to have the flashers on and damage to the front driver side wheel. The driver seat was occupied by a sleeping Hispanic male. I knocked on the glass of the door, but the male was unresponsive. I checked to see if the driver's side door was unlocked. The door was unlocked, and I was able to open it to make contact with the driver. I woke up the driver and asked if he was okay. The driver stated he was fine and that he was waiting on family members to come pick him up. The driver identified himself by name and date of birth as Cadena, Josue (W/M; DOB xxxxx). Josue was checked through MCSO Dispatch by name and date of birth. MCSO Dispatch advised that Jose had a warrant through Montgomery County JP 3, warrant #24017JV, for Capias Pro Fine - Theft Under \$50.00. The warrant was confirmed, and I placed Josue under arrest. The motor vehicle was towed by Quik Tow and stored at 28075 Robinson Road. Josue was transported and booked at the MCSO County Jail.

On 12/22/2018 at 1415 hours I, Officer Jarred Young, was dispatched to a Motor Vehicle Accident in the 27600 Block of IH-45 Southbound Feeder Road. When arriving on scene, I observed a white 2016 Toyota Corrola, displaying TX LP# xxxxx, with emergency flashers on. I made contact with the

driver who identified himself as Attifuddin Syed (A/M; DOB xxxxxx) with Texas DL #xxxxxx. Syed stated that he was traveling southbound second to right lane of the of the IH-45 South Feeder Road. As he was traveling southbound, he observed a black Ram 1500 pickup truck in the lane to the right of him. The Dodge truck began to come over in his lane and struck the passenger side of his vehicle where the front door ends, and the back door begins. The truck struck his motor vehicle with the front driver side quarter panel. Syed began to get over to the shoulder of the road to exchange information. As Syed was getting over, he observed the truck getting over behind him and continuing to drive southbound behind him, and then the truck fled the scene. Syed did not have any physical injuries and declined EMS. Syed was not able to get a license plate number and he was not able to observe the driver of the truck. The damage to Syed's vehicle is estimated at approximately \$1000.00. Officer Teske took pictures of the damage to the Toyota, and the pictures were downloaded to the server at the ORNPD. I completed a CR-3 Crash Report with case# 18P008909.

On 12/24/2018 at approximately 17:00 hours I, Office Jared Young, was contacted by Mareno Melendez, Mario (H/M; DOB xxxxxxxx) who identified himself by Texas DL #xxxxxxxx. Mario stated that he was the manager at T-Mobile and he wanted an Officer to come by the store because he believed that there was an attempted burglary of the store at some point during the night. I showed myself enroute to 26880 IH-45 North Feeder to the location of the store. When arriving

on scene, I spoke to Mario who showed me where he observed damaged to the store windows that lead him to believe there was an attempted burglary. I observed 3 different areas at the north end of the store where the glass had been broken. Mario also pointed out that there were footprints in the north east corner of where one of the areas of the glass were broken. I was able to observe one full footprint. Photos of the scene were taken of the damage and the footprint.

Mario agreed to fill out a voluntary statement stating the following:

On 12/23 at 3pm, when walking outside I noticed there was a dent on one of or faux windows. Upon closer inspection there were 3 different windows that had been broken. Multiple footprints are present right by the windows. An incident report has been field with T-Mobile. I saw the same windows were intact on 12/18/18.

Mario believed that the incident occurred sometime during the night between 12/18/2018 to 12/20/2018. Mario advised there was a work crew that were working on the store overnight for maintenance between 12/21/2018 to 12/22/2018 and believed that there was no attempted burglary while the crew was there. Mario was given a contact with a case number and advised that if there was any continued suspicious activity at the store.

I, Officer Durham, on 12/23/2018 at approximately 0259 hours was notified by MCSO Dispatch of a single car MVA in the 27500 block of the IH 45 North Feeder. I arrived on scene and observed a black Chevrolet Impala, displaying a temporary TX LP #xxxxxxx. The driver of the Impala had driven over the curve and into the median between the parking lot and the feeder road. My investigation revealed the following information.

The driver of the Impala identified himself as Samuel Egbo (B/M; DOB xxxxxxxx) by his USA Permanent Resident card, #xxxxxxx. Egbo stated he did not have a driver's license and he did not have insurance on the vehicle. Egbo stated he was driving N/B when he tried to turn into the parking lot and his tires began to slide into the median. A search on my MDT revealed Egbo's TX DL, #xxxxxxx, was Not Eligible due to the following suspensions:

I contacted the ADA Ghutzman and asked if he would accept the charge of DWLI with previous suspension(s) against Egbo. ADA Ghutzman stated he would accept the charge of DWLI with previous suspension(s) against Egbo. Egbo was arrested for DWLI due to his DL active suspensions, past DWLI convictions, and no insurance. Egbo was placed in the back of my patrol car.

I transported Egbo to the MCSO South County Jail for booking. As MCSO Jailer, Clements, began to search Egbo in the booking process, Egbo began to resist and refused to follow directions. He resisted by stiffening his body and used his body to push against the Clements and me. Clements

advised me that I needed to take Egbo to the MCSO Jail in Conroe due to his noncompliance.

I placed Egbo back into my patrol car and notified MCSO Dispatch that I would be transporting Egbo to the MCSO Jail. In transporting, Egbo began to roll around in my patrol car and began to place his feet against the door of my vehicle. I notified MCSO Dispatch that I would be driving modified due to Egbo's escalating actions.

I arrived at the MCSO Jail in Conroe without further incident. The MCSO Jailers took custody of Egbo for booking and processing. I searched the back of my patrol vehicle after Egbo was removed from the back seat. I found a clear plastic bag, containing what I know to be marijuana residue based on my training and experience as a Police Officer. Egbo was issued an Oak Ridge North PD citation, #71431, for No Insurance.

The Impala was towed by Loveday Towing to 28075 Robinson Road.

I submitted the clear plastic bag with marijuana residue to the ORNPD evidence room for destruction.

On Sunday, 12/23/2018, at approximately 2144 hours I, Officer Valdez, was doing a business check at the T mobile, located at 27880 IH 45 North Feeder. While conducting the business check, I observed a vehicle in the parking lot that was not there when I made a business check one hour earlier. I walked up to the vehicle and observed a male passed out in the driver's seat. A welfare call was built, and I then tapped on the window to check on the male. The male

woke up and rolled down his window to talk to me. When the window was rolled down, I smelled a strong odor of marijuana coming from inside the vehicle. I asked the male to step out of the vehicle because I had probable cause to search the vehicle due to the strong odor of marijuana. Once out of the vehicle, I asked the male subject for his TX DL to identify him, but he did not have one. I identified the driver by name and date of birth as Dylan James Newman, W/M, DOB xxxxxxxxx. I asked Newman if there were any illegal drugs in the vehicle before I searched it. Newman advised that he had a small amount of marijuana in the center console of his vehicle. I searched the vehicle and found a small amount of marijuana in the center console, contained in a clear plastic bag along with a grinder and a marijuana pipe. I asked Newman if he had insurance. He advised that he did not. I put out a fifteen-minute wrecker call and had Newman's vehicle towed due to No Driver's License and No Insurance. Newman also received two citations for No DL and No Insurance. Newman was instructed to dump the marijuana on the ground in front of my patrol vehicle and grind it on the pavement with the sole of his shoe. The grinder and pipe were also disposed. The pipe was smashed by Newman and the grinder was thrown in a trash bin. Newman called his parents, who were going to pick him up, and was then released at the scene. Newman's vehicle was towed by Loveday Towing to 28075 Robinson Rd, by chip #276. The tow slip has been turned in to the ORNPD along with citation #520761 for further review.

On 12/24/2018 at about 1925 hours I, Officer H. Richard (2722), was dispatched by MCSO to confirm warrants on a subject identified as Nekoe Alex-Zander Rodriguez, DOB xxxxxxxx, Hispanic male. DPS Trooper Montemayor (2C906) was out on traffic on Rodrigues for obscured license plate. I confirmed three warrants: warrant number 520003201 for speeding 61 MPH in a 45 MPH zone, with a fine amount of \$285.00; warrant number 5200032502 for Driving While License Invalid, with a fine amount of \$326.00; and warrant number 52000325V1 for Violate Promise to Appear, with a fine amount of \$375.00. The total fine amount is \$958.00. I met Trooper Montemayor at his traffic stop at 28099 IH 45 South Feeder, in the Drury Inn Suites parking lot. While on location, Rodriguez asked if he could pay the total fine amount. I advised him that the total fine amount is \$958.00. Rodriguez made restitution by two money orders. The first money order was made out to Oak Ridge North in the amount of \$458.00. The second money order was also made to Oak Ridge North in the amount of \$500.00. The total money order amount came out to be \$958.00. Rodriguez paid the total fine amount and was released from the scene. The money order and warrants were placed in the Oak Ridge North report box.

On 12/26/2018 at about 0139 hours I, Officer H. Richard (2722), was paroling east on Robinson Rd when I observed a tan Chevy pickup truck in front of me, bearing TX LP number xxxxxxxx. I checked the plates through my mobile data computer. The truck came back stolen out of the

Montgomery County Sheriff's Office. I turned on my red and blue emergency lights making a traffic stop at 145 Robinson Rd. The vehicle pulled into the Valero Gas Station parking lot. I made contact with the driver. The driver was identified by his TX DL number xxxxxxxx as Thomas Ward Simmons, DOB xxxxxxxx, white male. I also observed a female passenger in the front right seat of the pickup truck. The female was identified as Hannah Marie Baygents, DOB xxxxxxxx, white female.

While looking into the vehicle from the passenger's side. I observed a Chevy key that properly started the vehicle. I also observed an insurance paper that was to the vehicle and was addressed to Simmons.

I asked Simmons if he knew the vehicle was stolen.

Simmons stated Jerry Kapala and he had an agreed payment plan for the vehicle. Simmons was paying \$300.00 a month until the vehicle was paid in full. Simmons also stated that he missed two payments due to not having money.

I called ADA Dudley to see if he would accept charges on Simmons for UUMV. ADA Dudley stated that since they agreed on a payment plan for the vehicle that it would be a civil issue.

ADA Dudley did not accept charges on Simmons.

Montgomery County Dispatch confirmed this vehicle was stolen through Montgomery County Sheriff's Office. I recovered the vehicle. The vehicle was towed by Milstead and stored at 29707 W. Hawthorne in poor condition.

I faxed the report to Montgomery County Dispatch to have the vehicle removed from the stolen data base. The vehicle was recorded by Montgomery County Dispatcher Covington (Z1051) on 12-26-2018 at 0152 hours. MCSO faxed proper paperwork to the Oak Ridge North Police Department. The

paperwork was attached to the report and placed in the Oak Ridge report box.

While on patrol at approx. 12-25-2018 at approx. 2130 hours I, Sgt. Barry, saw a red 2017 Hyundai Accent Bering Texas license plate xxxxxx eastbound in the 100 block of Robinson Road. This vehicle had a right headlight that was not working. I stopped the vehicle in the 27700 IH-45 E. Feeder Road. The driver identified himself as Michael Ray Holdren (w/m; dob xxxxxxx). Holdren advised he only had a Texas Identification card # xxxxxxx and has never had a driver's license. Holdren stated he did not have proof of financial responsibility on the vehicle. I returned to my patrol car and ran the license plate and the insurance showed unconfirmed, no match in the last 45 days. I then ran Michael Holdren and he showed several outstanding warrants out of Montgomery County. I asked Montgomery County Dispatch to confirm the warrants. Dispatch confirmed 3 active warrants for Order of arrest (nonpayment of child support) out of Montgomery County 418th District Court, driving while license invalid and failure to appear out of Montgomery County JP #1. Michael Holdren was arrested and placed in the rear seat of my patrol car. Michael Holdren was issued Oak Ridge North citation # 890999 for no proof of financial responsibility and driving while license invalid. Michael Holdren was given a warning for defective equipment, headlight.

I then identified the passenger who was sitting in the right front seat. She identified herself as Brittany Danielle Holdren (w/f: dob xxxxxxx). Brittany Holdren showed 4 outstanding

warrants out of Montgomery County. Dispatch confirmed the active warrants for Capias Pro Fine/ Felony original charge credit card abuse out of Montgomery County 435th District Court, no driver's license, No driver's license, and failure to appear out of Montgomery County JP #1. Brittany Holdren was arrested and placed in the back seat of my patrol car.

I started a 15 Minute Oak Ridge North wrecker call. Officer Richard started inventorying the vehicle for the tow. Officer Richard found a syringe in the glove compartment. Officer Richard called the syringe to my attention. I saw the syringe had a clear liquid inside, showing approx. 15cc. Michael Holdren advised it was his grandfather's diabetic medication and he does not know why it was left in the vehicle. Michael Holdren stated he was a heroin user. He stated the other syringes are his, but he does not have any heroin with him at this time. The clear substance tested positive using a NIK field test kit for methamphetamine. Michael Holdren stated he would take the charge for it because Brittany Holdren did not know about it. Michael Holdren again stated that his drug of choice was heroin and not methamphetamine. Michael Holdren was charged with possession of controlled substance PG1 less than 1 gram.

The vehicle was towed by A-Plus to 6317 Big Oaks. They were transported to the Montgomery County Jail. The syringe containing the liquid methamphetamine weighed 2.7 grams using an Ohaus triple beam scale. The methamphetamine was placed into Oak Ridge North evidence locker.

On Friday, 12/21/2018, at approximately 2218 hours I, Officer Valdez, was patrolling on Woodson/IH 45 North Feeder. I was driving past the alley behind Kirkland's and observed a vehicle with a male standing outside of the vehicle. I made contact with the male and identified him by name and DOB as Rodney Alan Kent, W/M, DOB xxxxxx. Kent's vehicle displayed TX LP # xxxxxx. I asked Kent what he was doing behind the alley. Kent advised that he was dumpster diving because he lives out of his vehicle and tries to look for anything of value in dumpsters. I asked Kent if he had anything illegal in the vehicle, Kent advised that he had an old olive oil can that the Constables were after, but he did not know why. He stated that he got it from another male and did not know what was in it. I asked Kent if I could have consent to search his vehicle, Kent consented and filled out a voluntary statement form. I searched the vehicle, but nothing was found. The substance in the old olive oil can was tested with several NIK test kits to make sure there were no drugs in it. All test kits came back negative. Kent was then given two citations for No Driver's License , and No Insurance. Kent was eventually released from the scene and I returned to service.

The citation number given to Kent is, 520759.

On 12/27/2018 at approximately 1420 hours, I, Officer Teske, was advised by MCSO Dispatch of an animal call at 215 Wedgewood Ct. The call notes stated the reportee shot a neighbor's dog that was attacking his cat and he believed the dog was dead. I arrived on location and met with the reportee, identified as Ivan Brooks (W/M; DOB xxxxxxxx), in

the backyard of the residence. Mr. Brooks advised that at approximately 1406 hours, he was forced to shoot the neighbor's dog in self-defense. His residence backs up to 214 Hillside Ct, and they share a common six-foot wooden picket fence. He advised that three dogs from 214 Hillside Ct broke one of the pickets down and attempted to attack his cat. The cat was able to climb up a tree and Mr. Brooks was able to get two of the three dogs back into their own yard. The third dog, a tan ridge back that was approximately 70 pounds, would not return to its yard and became aggressive with him. Mr. Brooks retrieved his .40 cal Kahr semi-automatic pistol from his house and again attempted to get the dog to retreat into its own yard. He advised the dog snapped at him and fearing for his safety and the safety of his cat, he shot the dog one time in the head. I observed the dog was laying on a concrete slap on the N/E corner of the house. The dog was obviously deceased and had blood coming from the area around its head. I observed Mr. Brooks was upset and emotional about having to shoot the dog. I asked if he would provide a written statement and he stated that he would.

He provided the following statement:

I took a picture of the wooden fence, the dog, and the Kahr pistol. The pictures were downloaded to the server at the ORNPD.

The owner of the dog, Ann Wilson (W/F; DOB xxxxx) arrived on location and was also visibly upset. She apologized to Mr. Brooks that he was placed in the position to have to shoot the dog. She also agreed to pay to have the damaged fence fixed.

On Thursday, 12/27/2018, at approximately 1843 hours I, Officer Valdez, was asked by MCSO 2 Dispatch to confirm a local ORNPD warrant that Deputy Constable Bridges (8336) was out on. Deputy Constable Bridges was out on Raymond Scott Martinez, H/M, DOB xxxxxxx. I drove to the ORNPD and confirmed three outstanding ORNPD warrants. I advised Dispatch and Deputy Constable Bridges advised that he meet me at the ORNPD. When Deputy Constable Bridges arrived at my location, I made contact with Martinez and offered him the opportunity to make restitution. Martinez advised that he did not have the funds, but his mom could pay for the outstanding ORNPD warrants. Martinez attempted to call his mother several times, but she did not answer. He then called his step father, but his step father advised him that he would try and get in contact with Martinez mother and tell her to call Martinez. Martinez mother did not call so I allowed Martinez to attempt to get in contact with her, but his mother did not answer. After several failed attempts I placed Martinez in custody and transported him to the Conroe Jail for the following warrants:

#1100267 01 - Expired Registration - Fine amount of \$395.80.

#1100267 02 - No Proof of Financial Responsibility-UVFR - Fine amount of \$658.40.

#1100267F01 - Failure to Appear/Bail Jumping - Fine amount of \$502.40.

The total fine amount for the warrants is \$1,556.60.

The SID # for the warrants is 08537382.

Martinez advised that he turned himself in to officers because he had warrants and could not get a job, so he wanted to get them paid off. Martinez was taken into

custody from his residence by Deputy Constable Bridges, so there was no towed vehicle.

Copies of the warrants along with the arrest report have been turned in to the ORNPD for further review.

On Friday, 12/28/2017, at approximately 0424 hours I, Officer Valdez (2734), was patrolling near the 27900 block of the IH 45 North Feeder. I observed a white male walking along the feeder road. I made contact with the male to check on his welfare because it was early in the morning and the male had no jacket and appeared to be cold. I made contact with the male and he told me his name was JUVENILE. He advised that he was walking to Downtown Houston to meet his boyfriend. I asked him how old he was, and he told me he was sixteen years old. I asked if his parents knew he was gone from his home. He advised that they did. I asked for a phone number for his parents to verify that they allowed him to leave they're home. I was given a phone number for the father who I identified through the phone as Cacy Robert Day, W/M, DOB xxxxxxxx. Cacy advised that his son gave me a wrong name and then gave me his real name and DOB. I eventually identified the male on the welfare check as JUVENILE, W/M, DOB xxxxxxxx. Cacy advised me that JUVENILE is in the custody of CPS and does not live with his parents who live in Midland, Texas. JUVENILE was living in a shelter for Juveniles called Sheltering Harbor but decided to run away on 12/27/2018 at approximately 1700 hours. JUVENILE was later entered as missing at approximately 2300 hours by Harris County Sheriff's Office. I advised MCSO to give me confirmation on Kevin being a missing juvenile,

and confirmation was given. Kevin was then transported to the CJC Juvenile Jail without further incident and released to the custody of Juvenile Correctional Officers.

The NIC number for the missing juvenile is, M034973139.

My report was sent to TLETS and the juvenile was cleared from TLETS as missing.

On 12-28-2018 I, Sgt. Barry was advised by Montgomery County Dispatch that Aundrea Dewayne Holmes (h/m; dob xxxxxxx) showed to have outstanding Oak Ridge North Municipal Court. I confirmed 3 active warrants for fail to maintain financial responsibility warrant #5200025001 for \$468.00, driving while license invalid warrant #5200025002 for \$326.00 and failure to appear/bail jumping warrant #52000250F1 for \$318.00. the Total fine amount \$1,112.00. I arrived at Department of Public Safety Trooper Turner's location at Sawdust at IH-45. Trooper Turner advised he had Holmes under arrest for DWI following a traffic accident investigation. Trooper Turner took the Oak Ridge North warrants and served the warrants at the Montgomery County Jail.

On 12/30/2018 at about 0420 hours I, Officer H. Richard (2722), was patrolling on Hanna Rd and Robinson Rd. I observed a gray Ram 1500 with obscured temporary paper plates in front of me. The paper plate was obscured from one bold that made a hole, making the first number

unreadable. I also observed a second temporary paper plate under the obscured plate. This violates Transportation code 504.010 Section B. Transportation code 504.010 Section B, Issuance and Placement of License Plate is as follows:

(a) On payment of the prescribed fee, an applicant for motor vehicle registration shall be issued a license plate or set of plates.

(b) Subject to Section 504.901, the department shall issue only one license plate or set of plates for a vehicle during the registration period set by rule.

(c) The board may adopt rules regarding the placement of license plates for a motor vehicle, road tractor, motorcycle, trailer, or semitrailer.

I turned on my red and blue emergency lights, making a traffic stop at 27421 Robinson Rd. I made contact with the driver and observed a front right passenger. I asked the driver for his license and insurance. The driver stated that he did not have a license with him. The driver was identified by his name and date of birth as Patrick Morrison, DOB xxxxxx, white male. Morrison was unable to show proof of insurance for the vehicle. The passenger willing identified his self as Michael Wyatt, DOB xxxxxxxx, white male. I returned to my patrol vehicle and checked both subjects through my Mobile Data Computer (MDC). Morrison's TX DL number of xxxxxxxx came back Invalid. Wyatt TX DL number of xxxxxxxx came back valid. I returned to Morrison's vehicle and advised him that his vehicle will be towed due to not having a valid driver's license and no insurance for the vehicle. I asked both subjects to step out of the vehicle and to stand by my patrol vehicle. I advised Morrison that upon towing the vehicle I must conduct an inventory of the vehicle.

While conducting an inventory of the vehicle, I observed a camo bag that had a letter (M) imprinted on the front of it. This bag was located on the floor board, behind the driver's seat. The bag was half-unzipped, and I observed multiple clear baggies with white crystallized substance in it. There were a total of seven individual clear zip lock baggies containing the crystallized substance. I also observed multiple clear empty zippered lock baggies. There was a total of 19 clear empty zippered lock baggies. I tested the white crystallized substance from every clear zip locked baggie with a (U) NIK Test Kit and the Kit showed blue indicating positive for methamphetamine. I weighed each Ziplock baggie containing the methamphetamine with an Ohaus Dial-O-Gram scale. Each of the zippered lock baggies contains the following weigh:

Baggie (1)	14.6 grams
Baggie (2)	7.7 grams
Baggie (3)	7.4 grams
Baggie (4)	6.6 grams
Baggie (5)	5.9 grams
Baggie (6)	3.0 grams
Baggie (7)	2.3 grams

The total weighs of the methamphetamine total out to be 47.5 grams.

I called the on duty ADA and he accepted charges on Morrison for Manufacture and Delivery with Intent to Distribute, PG1 4g < 200g.

I placed Morrison in custody at 0430 hours. Morrison's vehicle was towed by Momentum Wrecker and stored at 27421 Robinson Rd in poor condition. Morrison was issued citation number 11001558 for Driving While License Invalid,

Fail to Maintain Financial Responsibility and Failed to Display Driver's License.

On 12/30/2018 MCSO Deputy Stanford (6p1080) was dispatched to a disturbance in progress at 1488/ Kuykendahl, on the side of the roadway between a male and female walking. The male was identified as Anthony Pope (W/M; DOB xxxxxxxx). When Deputy Stanford checked Pope through his MDT, Pope showed to have active warrants out of the Oak Ridge North PD. I arrived at the Oak Ridge North PD and confirmed that Pope had three active warrants through the Oak Ridge North Municipal Court. The warrants that were confirmed showed to be:

Pope was unable to pay restitution and was taken into custody. Pope was transported to the MCSO Main Jail in Conroe for booking. I did not identify the female. MCSO released her from the scene.

On 12/31/2018 at approximately 1530 hours, I, Officer Teske, observed a black Chevrolet HHR, displaying TXLP# xxxxxx,

traveling N/B in the 26500 block of the IH 45 North Feeder Road. A check of the license plate on my MDT showed the registration expired June 2018 and the insurance, Old American County Mutual policy xxxxxxxx, expired 06/29/2018. I took after the vehicle and observed the vehicle turn E/B onto Lane Ln from the N/B Feeder Road. When I turned E/B onto Lane Ln, I no longer saw the vehicle. I then went and sat in a parking lot in the 26900 block of the N/B Feeder Rd. At approximately 1542 hours, I observed the same Chevrolet HHR turn N/B out of the Arlan's parking lot (26800 IH 45 North Feeder Rd) onto the Feeder Road, and then immediately turn back into the parking lot. Shortly thereafter, I observed the vehicle turn into the 100 block of Lane Ln, in what appeared to be an apparent attempt to try and not pass by my current location. I caught up to the vehicle in the 26900 block of Westwood Drive. I made contact with the driver and he immediately stated that he knew he was going to get caught. I asked for his driver's license and he stated that it was no good. I had him step from the vehicle and placed him into handcuffs. He was identified by TDL # xxxxxxxx as Landen Dale McWhirter (W/M; DOB xxxxxxxx). I asked if he had insurance and he advised that he did not. The passenger was identified as Landen's brother, Nathaniel McWhirter (W/M; DOB xxxxxxxx). A check of Landen's TDL on my MDT showed that it was Not Eligible Due to the active suspension(s) and previous conviction(s) for DWLI, and/or the active suspension(s) and no insurance, Landen was arrested for the offense of Driving While License Invalid (M/B) - enhanced with previous conviction and/or no insurance.

The vehicle was released to Nathaniel. Landen was transported to the MCSO South County Jail Annex for

booking. He was issued ORNPD citation # 8901007 for the offense of No Insurance.

On 12/31/2018 at approximately 1711 hours, I, Officer Teske, was advised by MCSO Dispatch of a theft past located at T-Mobile. T-Mobile is located at 27880 IH 45 North. I arrived on scene and met with the assistant manager, who identified herself as Tashea Green (B/F; DOB xxxxxx). Ms. Green advised that two black males and a black female stole two display phones around 1650 hours. She stated the suspects came into the store and stated they were waiting for their grandmother because they were on her account. They then broke the wire holding a Samsung phone and an Apple iPhone. The suspects then fled the scene in an older model Nissan Altima with paper tags. Ms. Green was not able to get the paper tag number.

She described all the suspects as being short, approximately 5-04 and being in their late teens to early twenties. She advised the female was wearing all black and had short chunky locks (hair). One of the males was wearing all black with white writing on the shirt sleeves. The other male was wearing a blue jacket, gold doo rag, and blue/red Nike shoes.

The Samsung Note 9 was purple in color, valued at \$1000.00, and displayed serial # xxxxxxxxxxxx.

The Apple iPhone XS was black in color, valued at \$1000.00, and displayed serial # xxxxxxxxxxxx.

**Ms. Green advised T-Mobile loss prevention will have to provide the store surveillance video.
A copy of this report was sent to MCSO Dispatch so the phones could be entered as stolen.**

While on patrol at approximately 1917 hours on 12/31/2018 I, Sgt. Straight, was asked by MCSO 2 Dispatch to confirm outstanding warrants out of ORN. DPS Trooper Chapman was out on Navarro, Fernando Michael W/M xxxxxxxx, who showed to have a warrant out of ORN. I confirmed warrants on subject Navarro. I met with DPS Trooper Chapman at ORNPD. I made contact with Navarro, Fernando Michael and asked subject Navarro if he could make restitution or he would have to go to jail. Navarro, Fernando Michael stated that he could pay the total of \$1453.00 on the warrants. I took custody of Navarro, Fernando Michael for the following outstanding ORNPD warrants and he paid the total with money order.

The total fine amount for ORNPD warrants is \$1,453.00

The SID # for the warrants is 08382865.

On 01/01/2019 at approximately 0251 hours I, Officer Durham (Unit 2728), was traveling in the 27100 block of the IH 45 N Feeder Road. I observed a silver Dodge Caravan, bearing

Texas LP #xxxxxxx. A search on my MDT revealed that the Dodge's insurance was unconfirmed; last match not within 45 days. I activated my emergency lights and stopped the vehicle in the 27900 block of the IH 45 North Feeder. My investigation revealed the following.

I observed two occupants in the Dodge. The driver identified himself as Gregory Mitchell (B/M; DOB xxxxxxxx) by his name and DOB. I asked for his driver's license and insurance information. Mitchell did not have proof of insurance or his driver's license. The passenger identified herself as Stephanie Morris (B/F; DOB xxxxxxxx) by her TX ID #xxxxxxx.

A search on my MDT revealed Mitchell had a TX DL #xxxxxxx and it showed to be Not Eligible - Expired. My MDT also revealed that Mitchell had a local Capias Pro Fine warrant from Montgomery County Court at Law #1 for POM <2oz. MCSO Dispatch was able to confirm on the warrant. Mitchell was arrested and placed in my patrol car.

I issued Mitchell an Oak Ridge North citation #11001563 for Driving While License Invalid and Fail to Maintain Financial Responsibility.

The Dodge was driven from the scene by Morris.

Mitchell was transported to MCSO South County Jail for booking without incident.

On 12/31/2018 at approximately 2058 hours I, Officer Durham (Unit 2728), observed fireworks in the air at ORN Baptist Church, located at 500 E Oak Hill Dr. I arrived on scene and my investigation revealed the following.

Fireworks were being discharged across the parking lot of ORN Baptist Church. I observed a W/M with a bottle rocket in his hand. I approached the W/M and advised him he could not be shooting fireworks in Oak Ridge North. I asked the male for his DL. He identified himself as Dennis Riley (W/M; DOB 03/12/1977) by his TX DL, #xxxxxxx.

I issued Riley a ORNPD citation #11001560 for Discharge of Fireworks. Riley's fireworks were confiscated for destruction and placed in the dumpster at the ORNPD office. I advised Riley to leave and he left the scene without incident.

On 01/01/2019 at approximately 2117 hours I, Officer Durham (Unit 2728), was dispatched to a burglary of a vehicle at Chi, located at 27100 IH 45 North Feeder. I arrived on scene and my investigation revealed the following.

The reportees were standing by their vehicles, a black Ford Fusion, TX LP #FTY5337 and a red Ford F150, TX LP #xxxxxx, that were parked next to each other on the north side of Chi facing the IH 45 North Feeder. I observed that the front passenger window on both vehicles were broken out. The owner of the Fusion identified himself as Matthew Dagrella (H/M; DOB xxxxxx) by his TX DL #xxxxxxx. The owner of the F150 identified himself as Marcos Leal (H/M; DOB xxxxxxxx) by his TX DL #xxxxxxx. Dagrella stated he and Leal arrived at Chi at 2045 hours and noticed the vehicle's windows were shattered when they came back out at approximately 2114 hours. The estimated cost to replace the window on the vehicles is #325.00 each.

Dagrella stated the following was stolen from his vehicle:

6 Mercers knives (\$400.00)

Camo knife bag (\$50.00)

Cooking Thermometer (\$20.00)

Kid's backpack (Value \$25.00)

Two child story books (Value \$20.00)

5 Hot Wheel cars (Value \$5.00)

Total Value of all stolen items was \$520.00.

Dagrella advised that he did not have model or serial numbers for any of the stolen items and did not believe that he would be able to find them.

Leal stated that nothing was missing out of his F150 at that time.

I took pictures of the Fusion and F150 that were downloaded to the server at the ORNPD.

I asked the employees at Chi if they had any outdoor cameras. The Chi employees advised me they did not have any outside cameras.

Currently the suspects are unknown.

While speaking with the Chi employees, MCSO dispatched advised ORNPD of another burglary of a vehicle at Bowlero, located at 27000 IH 45 North Feeder. Officer Valdez (2734) assigned himself to the call #19P000019. Officer Valdez and I believe these calls involve the same suspect(s) and are connected.

On Tuesday, 01/01/2019, at approximately 2050 hours I, Officer Valdez (2734), was Dispatched by MCSO 2 Dispatch to a burglary of a motor vehicle past call at the 27000 Block of the IH 45 North Feeder (Bowlero). I arrived on scene and

made contact with the reportee who the victim was also and identified him by TX DL as, Jeffrey Robert Waring, W/M, DOB 06/23/1964, #14404839. Waring was waiting in the front entrance of the Bowlero when I arrived on scene and advised that his vehicle was burglarized while he was at Bowlero. Waring advised that his vehicle was on the west side of the building, so we walked over to the red Ford F-150, displaying TX LP# xxxxxxxx. I observed the front passenger window of the Ford broken out and broken glass all over the ground next to the passenger side window. Waring advised that he arrived at the Bowlero at approximately 2015 hours and then noticed his window was shattered at approximately 2150 hours. Waring advised that the vehicle was rummaged through, but nothing was taken. I attempted to get surveillance footage from the Operations Manager at the Bowlero, but the manager who I identified as Andie Allred advised that she was unable to release any footage because her corporate office instructed her in training not to release any footage to Law enforcement Officers. Allred advised that she could give me a phone number to call to attempt to get the footage, the number is xxxxxxxx.

The estimated cost to replace the window is \$300.00. The attempted burglary of the vehicle is believed to be committed by the same unknown individuals that burglarized the vehicle's in Officer Durham's (2728) call, case number 19P000018.

At this time the suspects identities are unknown.

On Tuesday, 01/01/2019, at approximately 1955 hours I, Officer Valdez, was asked by MCSO 2 Dispatch to confirm a local ORNPD warrant on a male that Trooper Bleecker (2C1002) was out on. Trooper Bleecker was out on Donte Jumal Calderon, B/M, DOB xxxxxxxx. I drove to the ORNPD and confirmed three outstanding ORNPD warrants. I met with Trooper Bleecker at his location at Sawdust/Budde and made contact with Calderon. Calderon was offered the opportunity to make restitution, but he did not have the funds to pay for the outstanding ORNPD warrants. I then placed Calderon in custody and transported him to the South County Jail without further incident for the following warrants:

#805359 01 - Failed To Dim Headlight-Meeting - Fine amount of \$349.00.

#805359 02 - No Driver's License - Fine amount of \$321.70.

#805359V 01 - Violate Promise To Appear - Fine amount of \$497.20.

The total fine amount is \$1,167.90.

The SID number for the warrants is 08577140.

The vehicle that Calderon was stopped by Trooper Bleecker in was his friend's and Trooper Bleecker released him from the scene with his vehicle, so no vehicle was towed.

Copies of the warrants along with the arrest report have been turned in to the ORNPD for further review.
