

POLICE ACTIVITY REPORT FEB 11 TO FEB 19

On 02/12/2019 at approximately 0823 hours I, Officer Jaren Young, was patrolling west on Woodson Road when I checked the plate of a black Chevrolet Camaro, displaying TX temporary tag #XXX. The tag on the vehicle showed that the registration was valid until 03/30/2019. My MDT showed that the registration had expired as of 01/30/2019. I conducted a traffic stop and made contact with the driver, who was identified as Marck Guillan (W/M; DOB xxx) by TX ID # xxx. I advised Marck that he was stopped because the vehicle's registration showed to be expired. I asked Marck for his DL and proof of insurance. Marck advised that he did not have a valid driver's license and he was unable to provide proof of insurance. When I checked the vehicle's VIN through my MDT, it showed that the vehicle was supposed to have TX LP # xxx displayed on it. I removed the paper tag and upon further inspection, it appeared that the temporary tag was fictitious. It appears it had been created on a personal computer. With the knowledge that Marck did not have a DL and that he had no proof of insurance, I advised Marck that the vehicle would be towed. I aired for a 15-minute Oak Ridge North wrecker call. Marck was also issued a citation, # 8901088, for **WRONG, ALTERED, OR OBSCURED REGISTRATION, DISPLAY EXPIRED LICENSE PLATE (REG), FAIL TO MAINTAIN FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY, and FAIL TO OBTAIN A DL. The vehicle was towed by Rickey's Wrecker to 9131 Hwy 242. Marck was given a copy of the tow information and a copy of the citation.**

On 02/12/2019 at approximately 1102 hours I, Officer Stafford (Unit 2723), was dispatched to confirm warrants on Billy Ray Montgomery, W/M, DOB xxx, TX DL #xxx. After arriving at the PD, I located four active ORN warrants on Billy. The warrants were for: Driving While License Invalid - #449201, fine \$326.00; Fail to Maintain Financial Responsibility - #449202, fine \$468.00; Fail to Display Driver's License -

#449203, fine \$209.00; and Failure to Appear - #4492F01, fine \$348.00. The total fine amount for the active warrants is \$1,351.00. After locating the warrants, I met Deputy G. Fruge, (2P1007) with the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office, at 29810 Lazy Lane. I asked Billy if he was able to pay the fines and he stated that he could not. I placed Billy under arrest and transported him to the MCSO South County Jail, without incident, for the active warrants.

On 02/12/2019 at approximately 1126 hours I, Officer Jaren Young, was dispatched to a theft past that occurred at 218 Westwood Court. The reportee advised that he noticed his shed door was open and that some of his equipment was missing. I arrived on scene and met with the reportee, who was identified as William Drew (W/M; DOB xxx, age 78). William advised that on Friday, 2/08/2019 at around 0900 hours, he exited the back door of his residence and noticed his tool shed, located in the back yard, had the door wide open. William checked the contents of the shed and noticed that a red Porter Cable 6 Gallon 150 PSI Pancake air compressor, Model # C2002, valued at \$99.00 was missing. William stated the compressor was located right inside the shed door on the floor and that it was gone now. William stated that he did not write down the serial number. I inspected the shed door and did not see any marks that would indicate forced entry into the tool shed. I advised William that I would be writing a report and if he noticed anything else missing, to call and report it.

On 02/12/2019 at approximately 2235 hours, DPS Trooper Fonteneaux (2C1003) made contact with Jacob Schehin (W/M; DOB xxx). Trooper Fonteneaux had stopped Schehin at Discovery Creek Road and the Grand Parkway. Schehin showed to have a warrant out of the Oak

Ridge North Municipal Court. Trooper Fonteneaux asked the ORN Police to confirm the warrant. I, Officer Durham, found one active Oak Ridge North Municipal Court Capias Pro Fine Warrant for the following:

Warrant #11000177F1 - Failure to Appear / Bail Jumping - Fine \$373.00 Total Fine Amount: \$373.00 I met Trooper Fonteneaux at HEB, located at 130 Sawdust Rd, Spring, TX 77380. I took custody of Schehin at 2252 hours. Schehin was unable to pay the total warrant amount of \$373.00. I transported Schehin to the MCSO South County Jail for booking. I advised Sgt. Nation of the warrant arrest.

On 02/13/2019 at approximately 1938 hours I, Sgt. Teske, was advised by MCSO Dispatch of a warrant service call at 1201 Lake Woodlands Drive. Dispatch advised that MCSO Deputy Parks (Unit # 6P1077) had Laketa Porter (B/F; DOB xxx) in custody on theft charges and she was showing active warrants through the Oak Ridge North Municipal Court. I confirmed the following three outstanding warrants through the Oak Ridge North Municipal Court:

Warrant # 52014701 - No Driver's License (\$209.00).

Warrant # 52014702 - No Proof of Financial Responsibility (\$438.00).

Warrant # 520147F01 - Failure to Appear/Bail Jumping (318.00).

The total fine amount was \$965.00.

I met with Deputy Sparks at 1201 Lake Woodlands Drive and he advised me that he would serve the warrants and add them to his booking sheet.

On 02/13/2019 at about 2213 hours, MCSO Dispatch aired an attempt to locate on IH 45 South near Research Forest. Dispatch advised that a Texas State Trooper (Trooper Balzekas, Unit # 2C1001) was just drug by a vehicle while on a traffic stop. The vehicle fled the scene. Dispatch advised the suspect was identified as Russell Patrick Richards, DOB xxx, black male. A picture of the suspect was sent out to Officers throughout the South County area. DPS was pinging

Russell's cell phone and it was determined that he was somewhere in the northwest area of Shenandoah. A manhunt ensued throughout the night.

At about 0138 hours on 02/14/2019 Sgt. Teske, (2704) with the Oak Ridge North PD, advised Dispatch that he was in the area of Research Forest and the IH 45 South Feeder Road. Sgt. Teske advised that he observed a male, wearing only blue running shorts with a red stripe, walking in the area. When Sgt. Teske turned around to speak with the male, the male ran into the woods on the southwest corner of the intersection. Officers then surrounded the area to try and locate the male. Shortly thereafter, Dispatch aired a suspicious person call at Homewood Suites, located at 29813 Interstate 45 North, Shenandoah, Texas. I, Officer Richard, was driving in the area of the Shenandoah Police Department at the time and observed a male, wearing only blue running shorts with a red stripe down the side, walking near the southbound Feeder Road in front of the Shenandoah Police Department. The Shenandoah Police Department is located at 29955 IH 45 South. The male saw me, then ran southbound into the Clarion Suites Hotel parking lot, located at 18456 IH 45 South, Shenandoah, Texas. I chased after the male on foot and yelled, "Stop Police" several times. The male continued to run away from me. I caught up to him and tackled him to the ground about 200 yards after I started chasing him. The male resisted as I attempted to restrain him and place him into handcuffs. He resisted by pulling away from me and attempted to get back onto his feet. I was able to place him into handcuffs. Texas State Trooper Bleecker (Unit # 2C1002) arrived on location and took custody of him. It was then determined the male was Russell Richards, the suspect from the earlier attempt to locate. I then returned to service. DPS Troopers on location asked that I file charges against Russell for evading arrest/detention on foot and resisting arrest. I contacted ADA Dudley and he advised these charges would not be accepted at this time, due to the higher felony charges being filed by DPS.

On 02/13/2019 at approximately 2108 hours I, Sgt. Teske, was checking vehicle speeds in the 26600 block of the IH 45 North Feeder Rd, using a Kustom Pro Laser 4. I observed a blue Nissan, displaying TX LP # xxx, traveling at a high rate of speed in the left lane. The Lidar indicated the vehicle was traveling 59 mph and the highest posted speed is 45 mph. I stopped the vehicle in the 27000 block of the IH 45 North Feeder Rd. The driver stated he didn't have his license or identification card with him and identified himself by name and date of birth as James Jackson (B/M; DOB xxx). He did not provide valid insurance for the vehicle and my MDT showed the insurance was Unconfirmed.

I had James step from the vehicle. When he got out of the vehicle, I observed marijuana debris on the front seat where he had been sitting. I asked him if there was anything illegal in the vehicle and he told me no. I told him there was marijuana debris on the driver seat and the car reeked of marijuana. He stated that he smokes marijuana but there was nothing in the car.

The passengers were identified by name and date of birth as Jerome McGee (B/M; DOB xxx), Taberah Williams (B/F; DOB xxx), and Tamia Williams (B/F; DOB xxx). I had all the occupants step out of the vehicle and began a search of the car. I immediately located a small clear plastic bag sitting on the front console between the driver and front passenger seat. The bag contained a usable amount of marijuana. I read the Miranda Warning to James, and Tamia Jackson, who had been sitting in the front right passenger seat. They both stated they understood their rights. I told them I found a bag with marijuana on the front console and asked who it belonged to. James raised his hand and stated it was his. I placed James into handcuffs and searched him prior to placing him into the rear seat of my patrol car. I also located a small clear plastic bag that contained marijuana, inside the front left lower cargo pocket on his pants. I used an NIC Marijuana Test kit, and the test kit showed a positive response for marijuana.

Taberah Williams had a valid TDL, #xxx, and the vehicle was released to her at James' request. James was transported to the MCSO South County Jail, where he was booked on the offense of Possession of Marijuana, under 2 ounces. James was issued ORNPD citation

#11001629 for the offenses of Speeding 59/45 and No Insurance. I took the marijuana to the ORNPD where it was weighed using an Ohaus Dial O Gram scale. The marijuana weighed 1.5 grams and was placed into evidence at the ORNPD.

On 02/14/19 at approximately 1630 hours I, Officer Kennerly, was dispatched to a duty upon striking a fixed object call, located at 26715 Oak Hill. Upon my arrival, I met with the witness, Patricia Phelps, white female, date of birth xxx. Phelps advised a gray Toyota Camry was occupied by a driver, later identified as JUVENILE, and an unknown female passenger. Phelps told me that JUVENILE ran a stop sign, going really fast, and lost control of his vehicle going around a curve. He drove into Phelps yard, causing a big rut in the yard and hitting a speed limit sign, partially knocking it over. JUVENILE then fled the scene. Phelps told me that the vehicle was still in the area, because it is a dead end and she had not seen the vehicle come out. I began looking for the vehicle and while looking for the vehicle, it had apparently left the area. Phelps got in her vehicle and followed JUVENILE. At this time, JUVENILE had already dropped the female passenger off. I was advised by our office that Phelps was following JUVENILE and I began trying to catch up with Phelps. I finally caught up with Phelps at Rayford/Imperial Oaks. I got behind the Toyota Camry, bearing Texas license plate xxx, and activated my lights. JUVENILE would not stop the vehicle. I began activating my sirens and JUVENILE began motioning with his hands as if he wanted me to follow him. This continued for approximately a quarter mile, then he turned right onto Wild Rose, still motioning with his hand to follow him even though I was constantly pressing my siren. He continued for another half a mile or so, until he pulled in to the address of xxx. I exited my vehicle to approach him and he opened his driver door. I grabbed him by his shirt, assisted him out of the vehicle, and onto the ground. He did not resist, and he placed his hands behind his back. I placed him in custody. I later found out that JUVENILE lives at xxx. I attempted to make contact with his guardians but was unsuccessful at the time. The vehicle was towed by South County Towing and

stored at 28075 Robinson Road. I contacted the Juvenile Prosecuting Attorney, Anna Emmons, and she advised she would accept charges on both the Duty Upon Striking over \$200 and Evading in a Motor Vehicle. I was finally able to reach JUVENILE guardian, his uncle Jonathan Bruny, white male, date of birth xxx. Bruny advised he wanted him to go to Juvenile anyway, to hopefully learn his lesson. Bruny also advised that he did not give JUVENILE permission to drive his vehicle.

Phelps was given a statement to complete and advised she would finish it and call when she was done. A copy of the Student Arrest Form was completed and sent to the CISD Police Department.

On 02/19/19 at approximately 0730 hours I, Officer Kennerly, contacted Phelps to try and see if she had finished the statement since it had not been turned in. She advised she forgot and would finish it today but said she did not get off until 1800 hours. I advised her that a night shift officer might be stopping by to pick it up if she was finished with it.

On 02/14/2019 at approximately 2051 hours I, Sgt. Teske, was checking vehicle speeds in the 26800 block of the IH 45 North Feeder Rd, using a Kustom Pro Laser 4. I observed the violator vehicle in the center lane at a high rate of speed. The violator swerved to the right lane to go around a vehicle ahead. The Lidar indicated the vehicle was traveling 68 mph and the highest posted speed is 45 mph. I stopped the vehicle in the 27000 block of the IH 45 North Feeder Rd, in the parking lot of Bowlero. The driver was identified as Nathan See (W/M; DOB xxx) by his TDL # xxx. A check on my MDT and with MCSO Dispatch revealed that Nathan had the following active warrants: Harris County, Judge Kelley Andrews, warrant # 2226179, for Poss Marijuana, under 2 oz.

Montgomery County JP 1, warrant # 1CC1012 for Speeding 10% Above Posted Speed.

Montgomery County JP 1, warrant # 1CC1012A for Violate Promise to Appear.

The warrants were confirmed, and I placed Nathan under arrest. The female passenger was identified as Chelsea Allen (W/F; DOB xxx) by her TDL # xxx. She stated the vehicle is registered to her but she and Nathan share the car. I had her step from the vehicle and began a search of the vehicle, incident to arrest. I located the following inside the center console arm rest:

Glass pipe containing burnt marijuana.

Metal grinder containing marijuana debris.

Three pieces of drinking straw and two small brown glass jars that contained a white powdery substance. The substance tested positive for cocaine when I used an NIC Test Kit.

Small rubber container that contained a tan wax substance. The substance tested positive for THC when I used an NIC Test Kit.

Swisher Sweet package that contained 30 green Alprazolam (Xanax) tablets marked "S903".

Clear plastic bag that contained marijuana. The marijuana tested positive when I used and NIC Test Kit.

I located four cartridges marked "Pineapple Express; SCLABS Hybrid THC 88.9% CBD 0.14%, 1.0 Grams/1000mg". Each appeared to have been used already, however each still contained THC oil.

I read Chelsea the Miranda Warning. She stated that she understood her rights and would speak with me. I asked her about the items inside the vehicle, including the marijuana, Xanax, and cocaine straws. She acted shocked and denied that she had knowledge the items were inside the vehicle. She denied any of the items were hers.

I read Nathan the Miranda Warning. He stated that he understood his rights and would speak with me. I asked him about the items inside the vehicle, including the marijuana, Xanax, and cocaine straws. He stated the knew the items were inside the vehicle and they were his. He stated they did not belong to Chelsea.

The vehicle was released to Chelsea. I transported Nathan to the MCSO South County Jail. He was booked on the three warrants; Possession CS PG 1, less than 1 gram, for the three straws and two small jars containing cocaine residue; and Possession CS PG 2, less than 1 gram, for the THC Oil. Due to the felony charges already being filed, the on-call ADA did not accept charges for Possession Controlled Substance PG 3, less than 28 grams for the Alprazolam (Xanax), or Possession of Marijuana under two ounces.

I weighed all items at the ORNPD using an Ohaus Dial O Gram scale. All items were placed into evidence at the ORNPD. The glass pipe and metal grinder had no evidentiary value and were destroyed by throwing them away at the ORNPD.

The three pieces of drinking straw and the two brown glass jars weighed 8.0 grams. Although the total weight was 8.0 grams, Nathan was charged with Possession of a Controlled Substance PG 1, less than one gram, because it appeared there was less than one gram of cocaine within the containers. The 4 THC oil cartridges and the rubber container with THC wax weighed 84.4 grams. Although the total weight was 84.4 grams, Nathan was charged with Possession of a Controlled Substance PG 2, less than one gram, because it appeared there was less than one gram of THC wax/oil within the containers. The 30 Alprazolam (Xanax) tablets weighed 7.4 grams. The marijuana weighed 15.3 grams.

On 02/14/2019 at about 2301 hours I, Officer H. Richard (2722), observed a green Nissan Altima passenger car, displaying TX LP number xxx, in front of me. I checked the vehicle's plate through my Mobile Data Computer (MDC). The vehicle's insurance return came back unconfirmed for more than 45 days. I made a traffic stop in the 27000 block of the IH 45 North Feeder Rd. The driver was identified as Andy E Alegria Caballero, DOB xxx, Hispanic male. The front right passenger was identified as Jose De Jesus Saldana, DOB xxx, Hispanic male. I checked both subjects through MCSO Dispatch. Caballero came back with two warrants. MCSO Dispatch confirmed warrant number 18-330395 out of County Court at Law # 1 for Fleeing Police Officer (Capias Pro Fine) and warrant number 1CC13655 out of Montgomery County Precinct 1 for No DL. Caballero's vehicle was released to Saldana. Saldana was released from the scene. Caballero was issued citation number 1696235 for No Financial Responsibility.

The above warrants will be attached to this arrest record.

On 02/16/2019 at approximately 2010 hours, DPS Trooper Sonnier (2C909) made contact with Tyler Widacki (W/M; DOB xxx). Trooper Sonnier had stopped Widacki at 501 Sawdust Rd. Widacki showed to have warrants out of the Oak Ridge North Municipal Court. Trooper Sonnier asked the ORN Police to confirm the warrant. I, Officer Durham, found two active Oak Ridge North Municipal Court warrants for the following: Warrant #1163623101 - Expired Registration - Fine \$266.00 Warrant #11636231F1 - Failure to Appear / Bail Jumping - Fine \$348.00 Total Fine Amount: \$614.00

I met Trooper Sonnier at 501 Sawdust Rd and took custody of Widacki at 2023 hours. Widacki was unable to pay the total warrant amount of \$614.00. I transported Widacki to the MCSO South County Jail for booking. I was refused at the MCSO South County Jail, due to Widacki's mental health. I transported Widacki to the MCSO Jail in Conroe, TX without incident. I advised Sgt. Nation of the warrant arrest.

On 02/17/2019 at approximately 0931 hours I, Officer Stafford (Unit 2723), was dispatched to confirm warrants on Clint Horatio Howard, W/M, DOB xxx. I located six active ORN warrants on Clint. The warrants were for: No Proof of Financial Responsibility - #5200087301, fine \$619.40; Expired Registration - #5200087302, fine \$356.80; Failure to Appear - #52000873F1, fine \$463.40; No Proof of Financial Responsibility - #89069501, fine \$619.40; Expired Registration - #89069502, fine \$356.80; and Failure to Appear - #890695F01, fine \$463.40. The total fine amount for the active warrants is \$2,879.20. I met Deputy Crower, (8314) with the Montgomery County Precinct 4 Constable's Office, at the Wal-Mart, located at Rayford Road and the Grand Parkway.

I asked Clint if he was able to pay the fines and he stated that he could not. I placed Clint under arrest and transported him to the MCSO South County Jail, without incident, for the active warrants.

On 02/16/2019 at approximately 0503 hours, Deputy Mcclintock (2P1018) made contact with Natony Bright (W/M; DOB xxx). Deputy Mcclintock had stopped Bright at 19513 Carmita Rd. Bright showed to have warrants out of the Oak Ridge North Municipal Court. Deputy Mcclintock asked the ORN Police to confirm the warrant. I, Officer Durham, found two active Oak Ridge North Municipal Court warrants for the following: Warrant #10440002 - No Driver's License - Fine \$369.20 Warrant #104400F01 - Failure to Appear / Bail Jumping - Fine \$510.90 Total Fine Amount: \$880.10 Deputy Mcclintock advised he was arresting Bright on other outstanding MCSO warrants. I delivered the ORN Municipal Court warrants to MCSO South County Jail. Deputy Mcclintock transported Bright to MCSO South County Jail for booking. I advised Sgt. Nation of the warrant arrest.

**On 02/17/2019 at approximately 2004 hours I, Officer Durham, stopped a white Chevrolet Tahoe, displaying TX LP # xxx, for speeding in the 26500 block of the IH 45 North Feeder Road. The Tahoe was traveling 60 mph and the highest posted speed is 45 mph. I stopped the vehicle in the 26800 block of the IH 45 North Feeder Road. The driver was identified as Guadalupe Salinas (H/M; DOB xxx), by TX DL # xxx. The passenger identified herself as Lesvia Reyes (H/F; DOB xxx) by her TX DL #xxx. A check on my MDT and with MCSO Dispatch showed that Salinas' TX DL was currently Not Eligible due to the following:
Salinas had previous convictions for Driving While License Invalid:
Offense Date 04/18/2013, Conviction Date 08/02/2013
Offense Date 12/12/2012, Conviction Date 01/23/2013
Offense Date 07/04/2010, Conviction Date 01/03/2014**

The search of Salinas' TX DL also revealed he had three active MCSO warrants from JP Court 4 for the following.

Failure to Appear - #221766AA

Display Expired License Plates - #221766

No Driver's License - #221767

MCSO Dispatch confirmed on the three warrants. Due to the active suspension(s) and previous conviction for DWLI, Salinas was arrested for the offense of Driving While License Invalid - enhanced with previous conviction. He was also arrested for the three active warrants.

A check on my MDT showed that Reyes' TX DL was valid. The vehicle released to Reyes and driven from the scene. I transported Salinas to the MCSO South County Jail for booking. He was also issued ORNPD citation # 11636312 for the offense of Speeding 60/45.

On 02/19/2019 at about 0100 hours I, Officer H. Richard (2772), observed a white Chevrolet Malibu, displaying TX LP number xxx, in front of me. I checked the vehicle's license plate through my Mobile Data Computer (MDC). The license plate came back with unconfirmed insurance for more than 45 days. I made a traffic stop at the Woodlands Mall, located at 1201 Lake Woodlands. The driver of the vehicle was identified by her TX ID number xxx as Kialonte Faith Babineaux, DOB xxx, black female. I asked Kialonte if she had insurance for the vehicle and she stated no. I also observed a front right passenger. The passenger was identified as Latarsha Necole Jones, DOB xxx, black female. I checked both subjects through my MDC. Kialonte came back with a valid TX ID but did not have a driver's license. Jones also came back with a valid ID but did not have a driver's license.

Kialonte was issued citation number 1696239 for Fail to Obtain DL and Fail to Maintain Financial Responsibility.

Due to Kialonte not having a driver's license or insurance, her vehicle was towed by Rickey's Wrecker and stored at 9131 SH 242, in poor condition.

Both subjects were released from the scene on foot.
