



UNMANNED AERIAL SYSTEMS (UAS) /DRONE POLICY

Out of safety concerns for our guests, employees and resort property, as well as concerns for individual privacy, Seven Springs Mountain Resort (Seven Springs) prohibits the operation of unmanned aerial systems (UAS) or drones without the written authorization from Seven Springs. This prohibition includes drones used for any purpose whatsoever, whether filming or videotaping or commercial or personal purposes or by media.

This prohibition extends to any drone launched or operated from Resort property, as well as drones launched from private property outside of the Resort but flying within Resort boundaries and/or above Resort facilities, both anywhere on the mountain or around the resort base area.

If drone use is authorized by the Resort for any event, such use must be in accordance with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) rules and regulations - The FAA Summary of Small Unmanned Aircraft Rule (Part 107).

Seven Springs has adopted the following Drone Policy. For all Commercial UAS (Drone) Operators, the following rules must be complied with in order to operate a Drone on Seven Springs property:

1. The UAS Operator shall execute the Seven Springs Limited Use of Resort Facilities Agreement which includes indemnifying and releasing Seven Springs from any and all liability. The UAS Operator shall also provide Seven Springs with a certificate of insurance evidencing insurance coverage and listing Seven Springs Mountain Resort, Inc., as Additional Insured as more specifically provided for in the Limited Use of Resort Facilities Agreement.
2. An application to request consent must be submitted to Seven Springs not less than 30 days prior to the date of the requested use of the Drone.
3. UAS Operator shall obtain a current Part 61 Pilot Certificate under the Small UAS Rule (Part 107); or a Remote Pilot Certificate; or Section 33 exemption, issued by the FAA. Seven Springs is not responsible for assisting with obtaining these certifications or exemptions. It is the sole responsibility of the UAS Operator to obtain the proper certification of exemption.
4. UAS Operator shall provide proof of a current UAS Certification or exemption at the time it is requesting written consent from Seven Springs. The Operator must have the proper certification or exemption in their possession when operating an unmanned aircraft at Seven Springs and be prepared to show it upon the request of Seven Springs. No person under the age of 18, even if certified under Part 107 or holding a current Part 61 pilot's license, may operate a UAS on or over Seven Springs' property.
5. No non-commercial use of Drone will be allowed on Seven Springs property.
6. No UAS may hover near the hotel, cabins, condos, or other housing used by Seven Springs guests or employees.
7. UAS Operators must maintain reasonably safe speed, height and distance when operating a UAS in the vicinity of persons or animals on Seven Springs property. "Buzzing" is not permitted.
8. UAS operators must as soon as feasible report to Seven Springs all UAS incidents and accidents occurring on or over Seven Springs property which the operators have reason to believe may result in injury to persons or damage to property.

9. UAS operators are prohibited from using a UAS to photograph or video a minor on Seven Springs property without first obtaining the written consent of the minor's parent or guardian.
10. Any violation of this policy may involve suspension of your access privileges at Seven Springs or the revocation of your season pass or day ticket, as well as confiscation of any prohibited equipment and my subject violators to any liability for damages, including, but not limited to damages for trespass, violations of privacy and physical injuries to persons and/or property as well as legal fees.
