Sacrament of Matrimony

In accordance with the regulations of the Bishop of Arlington, couples must contact a priest and begin preparation at least six months prior to the wedding. Parish registration and active participation for a minimum of 3 months is required before preparation may begin.

Living together before marriage is sinful and harmful to the future marriage. Couples who are living together will be asked to live separately during the preparation time.

What does it mean to be an active Catholic?



Frequently, those seeking to celebrate Marriage, have children baptized, or serve as sponsors for Confirmation or Baptism request a stating that they letter parishioners and active, practicing Catholics. *To receive such a letter*, one must be registered in the

parish for at least 3 months, attend Mass regularly, and be committed to a stewardship of time, talent, and treasure. We encourage all parishioners to become active in one of the parish organizations. community as large as Our Lady of Hope, one means of verifying participation is through the use of parish offertory envelopes. Special Speaker, Daniel Ali - May 29th

Come to the Parish Hall Friday, May 29th beginning at 7:00 p.m. to hear internationally-acclaimed Kurdish-American Evangelist and Author Daniel Ali. Daniel is an Iraqi Kurd who grew up as a Muslim under Saddam Hussein's campaigns against the Kurds, experiencing gassings and



chemical weapons attacks on thousands of his native villages. From his earliest days in Iraq, the Lord placed silent, but loving, Christian witnesses around him, since it has always been illegal in Muslim countries for a Christian to speak to a Muslim of Christianity or Christ.

Daniel began the non-profit Christian-Islamic forum in August 2001, just weeks before terrorists struck on 9-11. He has appeared on The Journey Home twice and recently taped his third appearance May 4.

Daniel has authored two books *Inside Islam: A Guide for Catholics*, in 2003 and *Out of Islam, Free at Last*, which was published in 2007. He co-produced with Fr. Mitch Pacwa a Video Series for EWTN called "Islam in Christianity" in 2002.
