Ellie Vasta is Associate Professor at the Centre for Research on Social Inclusion, Macquarie University, Sydney. From 2003 until 2009 she was a Senior Researcher at the Centre on Migration, Policy and Society at the University of Oxford. Ellie's recent work in Britain and Europe has focused on immigrant work strategies and networks in London with specific emphasis on immigrant participation, identity, community, and on irregular migration; on racism; and on the ideological shifts in the European models of immigrant inclusion, focusing on policies and public discourses. Her current projects include preparing a book on 'immigration and the new politics of solidarity' and another project on 'belonging'. Some recent publications include Vasta, E and Vuddamalay, V.
