### **DEFENSE OF FREEDOM INJURY BIOS**

- **James Blackwood (Decatur, Texas)** - Mr. Blackwood joined KBR in January 2004. He served on the Theater Transportation Mission as a Heavy Truck Driver, supporting logistical operations in Iraq. While enroute to Baghdad on 9 April 2004, he was injured by Small Arms Fire when his convoy was attacked by insurgents.
- **David Busby (Missouri City, Texas)** - Mr. Busby joined KBR in January 2004. He served on the Theater Transportation Mission as a Heavy Truck Driver, supporting logistical operations in Iraq. On 4 July 2004, he was injured when a mortar detonated in his vicinity at Camp Anaconda.
- **Glenn Cannon (Houston, Texas)** - Mr. Cannon joined KBR in March 2005. He served as a Subcontracts Administrator in Baghdad, Iraq. On 7 September 2005, he was struck by small arms fire at Camp Liberty. Mr. Cannon returned to duty after a full recovery, and currently works for KBR in Houston, Texas.
- **Tom Chamberlain (Vidor, Texas)** - Mr. Chamberlain joined KBR in November 2003. He served on the Theater Transportation Mission as a Heavy Truck Driver, supporting logistical operations in Iraq. While enroute to Baghdad on 9 June 2004, he was injured by Small Arms Fire when his convoy was attacked by insurgents.
- **Ernest Cook (Troy, Texas)** - Mr. Cook joined KBR in July 2004. He served on the Theater Transportation Mission as a Heavy Truck Driver, supporting logistical operations in Iraq. On 14 March 2005, Mr. Cook was injured when his convoy was struck with an Improvised Explosive Device and insurgent Small Arms Fire while enroute to Camp Anaconda, Iraq from Mosul. Mr. Cook is a veteran of the United States Marine Corps.

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- **Haysom, Jeffrey – (Yakima, Washington)-** Mr. Haysom joined KBR in October 2004. He served in the Theater Transportation Mission as a Heavy Truck Driver, supporting logistical operations in Iraq. He was injured while driving in a convoy bound for Taji from Cedar II when his convoy was attacked by an Improvised Explosive Device and insurgent Small Arms Fire. Mr. Haysom is a veteran of the United States Army.
- **Hoffman, Michael – (Smith's Grove, Kentucky)-** Mr. Hoffman joined KBR in August 2003. He served in the Theater Transportation Mission as a Heavy Truck Driver, supporting logistical operations in Iraq. On 23 March 2005, his convoy was attacked by an Improvised Explosive Device and insurgent Small Arms Fire. Mr. Hoffman is a veteran of the Kentucky National Guard.
- **Houpe, Gary – (Copperas Cove, Texas)-** Mr. Houpe joined KBR in August 2003. He served as a Transportation Supervisor for the Theater Transportation Mission, supporting logistical operations in Iraq. On 04 July 2004, he was injured at Camp Anaconda when the base received insurgent mortar fire. Mr. Houpe is a veteran of the United States Army.
- **King, Donald – (Houston, Texas) -** Mr. King joined KBR in July 2004. He served as a Labor Foreman at Camp Volunteer. On 05 October 2004, he was injured by indirect fire while escorting local workers. Mr. King is a veteran of the United States Army.
- **Leed, Barry – (Lancaster, Pennsylvania) -** Mr. Leed joined KBR in September 2004. He served in the Theater Transportation Mission as a Heavy Truck Driver, supporting logistical operations in Iraq. On 21 November 2004, he was injured when his convoy was attacked by an Improvised Explosive Device while enroute to Camp Anaconda from Mosul.

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- **McNabb, Wallace – (Lincoln, Nebraska)**- Mr. McNabb joined KBR in October 2004. He served in the Theater Transportation Mission as a Heavy Truck Driver, supporting logistical operations in Iraq. He was injured on 14 March 2005, when his convoy was attacked by an Improvised Explosive Device while enroute from Mosul to Camp Anaconda. Mr. McNabb is a veteran of the United States Army.
- **Pardo, Paul – (San Antonio, Texas)**- Mr. Pardo joined KBR in November 2003. He served as the Food Service Supervisor at Champion Air Base in Ar Ramadi. On 11 March 2004, Mr. Pardo was injured when the base received insurgent mortar fire. Mr. Pardo is a veteran of the United States Army.
- **Reneau, Roland – (Ft Worth, Texas)** - Mr. Reneau joined KBR in May 2004. He served in the Theater Transportation Mission as a Heavy Truck Driver, supporting logistical operations in Iraq. On 15 November 2004, Mr. Reneau was injured when his convoy was struck by an insurgent land mine while enroute to Camp Anaconda from Al Asad.
- **Sebastian, Romeo – (Las Vegas, Nevada)**- Mr. Sebastian joined KBR in September 2004. He served as a Food Service Worker at Camp Liberty. On 31 May 2005, he was injured when the base received insurgent mortar fire.
- **Sims, Michael – (Decatur, Alabama)**- Mr. Sims joined KBR in December 2004. He served as a Locksmith at Camp Liberty in Baghdad. On 31 May 2005, he was injured when the base received insurgent mortar fire. Mr. Sims is a veteran of the United States Army.
- **Smith, Kevin – (Abilene, Texas)**- Mr. Smith joined KBR in January 2004. He served as a Heavy Truck Driver in the Theater Transportation Mission, supporting logistical operations in Iraq. On 08 April 2004, he was injured when his convoy was attacked by insurgent Small Arms Fire and Rocket Propelled Grenades while enroute to Camp Ridgeway, Iraq.

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- **Socia, Allan – (Friendswood, Texas)-** Mr. Socia joined KBR in September 2003. He served in the Theater Transportation Mission as a convoy commander, supporting logistical operations in Iraq. On 28 October 2004, he was injured when his convoy was attacked by an Improvised Explosive Device while enroute to Camp Anaconda from Al Asad.
- **Williams, Joe, Jr. – (Memphis, Tennessee)-** Mr. Williams joined KBR in October 2003. He served in the Theater Transportation Mission as a Heavy Truck Driver, supporting logistical operations in Iraq. On 01 April 2005, he was injured when his convoy was attacked by an Improvised Explosive Device while enroute to Camp Anaconda from Camp Summerall.
- **Zimmerman, Thomas (Tommy) – (Little Rock, Arkansas)-** Mr. Zimmerman joined KBR in February 2004. He served in the Theater Transportation Mission as a Heavy Truck Driver, supporting logistical operations in Iraq. On 09 April 2004, he was injured when his convoy was attacked by insurgent mortars and Small Arms Fire while enroute to Baghdad International Airport.

- **Robert M. Carnes (Apollo Beach, Florida)** – Mr. Carnes joined KBR in December 2003 as a Heavy Truck Driver for the Theater Transportation Mission. Mr. Carnes was killed on 9 September 2005, when his convoy was attacked while enroute to Convoy Support Center Scania south of Baghdad, Iraq. Receiving the medal on behalf of Mr. Carnes is / are (shall finalize with NOK upon arrival in Houston).
- **Kevin Dagit (Jefferson, Iowa)** – Mr. Dagit joined KBR in September 2004 and served as a Heavy Truck Driver with the Theater Transportation Mission. Mr. Dagit was killed on 20 September 2005, when his convoy was attacked enroute to Forward Operating Base McKenzie in Iraq. Receiving the award on behalf of Mr. Dagit is / are (shall finalize with NOK upon arrival in Houston).
- **Sascha Grenner-Case (Sierra Vista, Arizona)** – Mr. Grenner-Case joined KBR in June 2004 as a Heavy Truck Driver for the Theater Transportation Mission. Mr. Grenner-Case was killed on 20 September 2005 when his convoy was attacked enroute to Forward Operating Base McKenzie in Iraq. Receiving the award on behalf of Mr. Grenner-Case is / are (shall finalize with NOK upon arrival in Houston).
- **Daniel Jurn (Stuart, Florida)** – Mr. Jurn joined for KBR in June 2004 as a Heavy Truck Driver for the Theater Transportation Mission. Mr. Jurn was killed on 12 November 2005 when his convoy was attacked enroute to Camp Anaconda, Iraq. Receiving the medal on behalf of Mr. Jurn is / are (shall finalize with NOK upon arrival in Houston).

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- **Christopher Lem (Lyndon Station, Wisconsin)** – Mr. Lem joined KBR in September 2004 and served as a Heavy Truck Driver with the Theater Transportation Mission. Mr. Lem was killed on 20 September 2005 when his convoy was attacked enroute to Forward Operating Base McKenzie in Iraq. Receiving the award on behalf of Mr. Lem is / are (shall finalize with NOK upon arrival in Houston).
- **Felipe Lugo (Copperas Cove, Texas)** – Mr. Lugo joined KBR in June 2004. He served as a Labor Foreman In Baghdad. Mr. Lugo was killed on 19 October 2004, during an insurgent attack on Forward Operating Base Independence. Receiving the award on behalf of Mr. Lugo is / are (shall finalize with NOK upon arrival in Houston).
- **Reuben R. Miller (Sugarcreek, Ohio)** – Mr. Miller joined KBR in June 2004. He served as a Heavy Truck Driver for the Theater Transportation Mission. Mr. Miller was killed on 12 May 2005 when his convoy was attacked enroute to Camp Dogwood, Iraq. Receiving the award on behalf of Mr. Miller is / are (shall finalize with NOK upon arrival in Houston).
- **Anthony Stramiello (Astoria, Oregon)** - Mr. Stramiello joined KBR in May 2004. He served as a Carpenter Foreman in Mosul, Iraq. Mr. Stramiello was killed on 21 December 2004 when a suicide bomber detonated a bomb inside the dining facility at Camp Glory. Receiving the award on behalf of Mr. Stramiello is / are (shall finalize with NOK upon arrival in Houston).
- **Larry Stilwell (Port Richey, Florida)** – Mr. Stilwell joined KBR in April 2005. He served as a Heavy Truck Driver with the Theater Transportation Mission. Mr. Stilwell was killed on 12 August 2005 when his convoy was attacked enroute to Al Taqaddum, Iraq. Receiving the award on behalf of Mr. Stilwell is / are (shall finalize with NOK upon arrival in Houston).
