

“THE IMAGE OF GOD IN THE FORM OF MAN”

GENESIS 1:1–2:3 (FOCUS ON 1:26–28)

[26] Then God said, “Let us make man in our image, after our likeness. And let them have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over the livestock and over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth.” [27] So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them. [28] And God blessed them. And God said to them, “Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it, and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over every living thing that moves on the earth.”

PSALM 115:4–8

[4] Their idols are silver and gold, the work of human hands.
[5] They have mouths, but do not speak; eyes, but do not see.
[6] They have ears, but do not hear; noses, but do not smell.
[7] They have hands, but do not feel; feet, but do not walk; and they do not make a sound in their throat. [8] Those who make them become like them; so do all who trust in them.

COLOSSIANS 1:15–16

[15] He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. [16] For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through him and for him.

REVELATION 22:1–5

[1] Then the angel showed me...the city; [3]...the throne of God and of the Lamb will be in it, and his servants will worship him. [4] They will see his face, and his name will be on their foreheads. [5] And night will be no more. They will need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign forever and ever.

WHO IS GOD?

What do these verses show us about God's character and attributes? What do they say about who God is?

WHAT HAS GOD DONE?

How do these verses reveal God's action? How do they point us to God's greatest act of sending Jesus to rescue us from our sins?

WHO ARE WE?

Based on these verses, who has God created us to be? What do they tell us about our identity?

WHAT DO WE DO?

What action does God call us to based on these verses? How should *who God is*, *what God has done*, and *who we are* (see above) shape the way we live?
