

PARDON

TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, between January of 2002 and January of 2012, in the General Sessions and Criminal Court for Knox County, Tennessee, Jeffrey Thomas Crick was convicted of driving on a revoked license (complaint no. A376938), theft (case nos. 961681, 95441, 599099), driving under the influence (case nos. 570974, 578652, 87552), and passing worthless checks (case nos. 05326 T, 05327 T); and

WHEREAS, Tennessee's constitution and statutory law authorize the governor to grant executive clemency, including the power to issue pardons; and

WHEREAS, this case appears to me to be a proper one for the exercise of executive elemency because Mr. Crick has demonstrated exemplary citizenship since the completion of his sentences, as well as a compelling reason for a pardon.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by Article III, Section 6, of the Tennessee Constitution and by the laws of the State of Tennessee, do hereby grant a pardon in favor of Mr. Crick, pardoning him for his convictions listed above.
