PARDON

TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, in January of 1999, in the Criminal Court for Shelby County, Tennessee, Jason Hall was convicted of one count of aggravated burglary and two counts of arson (case nos. 98-10125, 98-10126, 98-10128); and

WHEREAS, Tennessee's constitution and statutory law authorize the governor to grant executive clemency, including the power to issue pardons; and

WHEREAS, this case appears to me to be a proper one for the exercise of executive clemency because Mr. Hall has demonstrated exemplary citizenship since the completion of his sentences, as well as a compelling reason for a pardon.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by Article III, Section 6, of the Tennessee Constitution and by the laws of the State of Tennessee, do hereby grant a pardon in favor of Mr. Hall, pardoning him for his convictions listed above.
