

PARDON

TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, between April of 2008 and February of 2016, in the General Sessions Court for Benton County, Tennessee, Christopher Prince was convicted of two counts of theft under \$500 (case nos. 13TR2495, 11CR736) and one count of assault (case no. 3GS1-2007-CR-2409); and in the Criminal Court for Wayne County, Tennessee, Mr. Prince was convicted of three counts of driving on a suspended license, one count of driving under the influence, one count of theft, and two counts of evading arrest (case no. 15424); and in the Criminal Court for Humphreys County, Tennessee, Mr. Prince was convicted of three counts of theft over \$1,000 (case nos. 12943, 12798), one count of aggravated burglary (case no. 12798), and one count of theft under \$500 (case no. 12769), and one count of aggravated criminal trespass (case no. 16438); and

WHEREAS, Tennessee's constitution and statutory law authorize the governor to grant executive clemency, including the power to issue pardons; and

WHEREAS, this case appears to me to be a proper one for the exercise of executive elemency because Mr. Prince has demonstrated exemplary citizenship since the completion of his sentences, as well as a compelling reason for a pardon.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by Article III, Section 6, of the Tennessee Constitution and by the laws of the State of Tennessee, do hereby grant a pardon in favor of Mr. Prince, pardoning him for his convictions listed above
