

PARDON

TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, between 1985 and 1998, in the General Sessions and Criminal Courts for Davidson County, Tennessee, Pamela Waller was convicted of three counts of theft under \$500 (case nos. L43462, Z22165, 90-F-1811), one count of attempted forgery (case no. L52411), one count of attempting to pass worthless checks (case no. 87-S-1065), one count of attempted theft (case no. 90-F-1810), one count of speeding (case no. 82785M), and one count of driving on a suspended license (case no. SC171654); and one conviction for theft under \$500 in the Criminal Court for Williamson County, Tennessee (case no. 94-890); and

WHEREAS, Tennessee's constitution and statutory law authorize the governor to grant executive clemency, including the power to issue pardons; and

WHEREAS, this case appears to me to be a proper one for the exercise of executive clemency because Ms. Waller has demonstrated exemplary citizenship since the completion of her sentences, as well as a compelling reason for a pardon.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by Article III, Section 6, of the Tennessee Constitution and by the laws of the State of Tennessee, do hereby grant a pardon in favor of Ms. Waller, pardoning her for her convictions listed above.
