

PARDON

TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, between March of 1986 and March of 2002, in the Criminal Court for Davidson County, Tennessee, and the Criminal and General Sessions Courts for Rutherford County, Tennessee, Janet Watson was convicted of passing a forged prescription (case no. 92-C-1516); theft of property (case no. 92-C-1453); aggravated assault (case no. F-51719); simple assault (case no. F-47810A); driving on a revoked license (case no. 75GS1-1970); worthless checks (case no. 75GS1-1995-CR-558876); two counts of theft under \$500 (case nos. SC63943, SC63942); and simple possession (case no. 73043); and

WHEREAS, Tennessee's constitution and statutory law authorize the governor to grant executive clemency, including the power to issue pardons; and

WHEREAS, this case appears to me to be a proper one for the exercise of executive elemency because Ms. Watson has demonstrated exemplary citizenship since the completion of her sentences, as well as a compelling reason for a pardon.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by Article III, Section 6, of the Tennessee Constitution and by the laws of the State of Tennessee, do hereby grant a pardon in favor of Ms. Watson, pardoning her for her convictions listed above.
