PARDON

TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, between February of 2007 and March 2013, in the Criminal and General Sessions Court for Davidson County, Tennessee, and Morgan County, Tennessee, Tanika Woodard was convicted of failure to abide by court order (case no. 650000013423); driving on a revoked license (case no. SCE29163); theft of merchandise under \$500 (case no. SC925480); possession or casual exchange of a controlled substance (case no. GS377952); criminal impersonation (case no. GS404345); and aggravated assault (case no. 2013-I-213); and

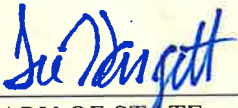
WHEREAS, Tennessee's constitution and statutory law authorize the governor to grant executive clemency, including the power to issue pardons; and

WHEREAS, this case appears to me to be a proper one for the exercise of executive clemency because Ms. Woodard has demonstrated exemplary citizenship since the completion of her sentences, as well as a compelling reason for a pardon.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by Article III, Section 6, of the Tennessee Constitution and by the laws of the State of Tennessee, do hereby grant a pardon in favor of Ms. Woodard pardoning her for her convictions listed above.
