AC Intern Update – Volunteers Needed

Following my chemical engineering undergraduate training at Clemson University and medical school at the University of South Carolina School of Medicine, I completed a surgical internship in my hometown of Greenville, South Carolina. I then served five years as a flight surgeon in the U.S. Air Force which included a tour in Afghanistan and the opportunity to provide medical assistance to NASA astronauts during the historic final space shuttle landing in July 2011.

I am currently in my final year of nuclear medicine residency training at Emory University. I am particularly interested in resource utilization and efficiency for medical imaging in the wake of dwindling healthcare dollars. I am excited to be a part of the SNMMI Academic Council, and I hope to understand and assist in addressing the challenges within our specialty to facilitate a bright future in nuclear medicine as a whole.

During the 2015 SNMMI Mid-Winter Meeting, the Academic Council discussed the potential value of obtaining data from nuclear medicine residencies pertaining to resident case numbers for commonly performed imaging studies and therapies. At this discussion, it was clear that information derived solely from radiology information systems would be insufficient as not all resident data would be captured from some programs. For the AC intern project, we would like to move forward in hopes of collecting sufficient

data from as many nuclear medicine programs as possible to establish normative values for nuclear medicine procedures performed during residency training.

As the new SNMMI Academic Council intern, I am spearheading this project and requesting your participation as a nuclear medicine program director to join with the other NM program directors in supporting this endeavor. In addition, I would like to ask for volunteers to set up a working group to help determine the breadth of procedures surveyed and which data sources should be accepted as valid given the variable conditions in residency training.

Some may ask why undertake such a project in the face of the ABR/ABNM proposal, but what better time to have hard data on what our residents do to guide any transition that may take place. This data would be made available to any entity that requests it, in the hopes that it would facilitate the discussion of what changes, if any, need to be made.
