Last week, our church received the difficult news that Dennis Fevegeon, our Interim Director of Mature Adults, would be taking a leave of absence for the summer. Dennis had recently taken over the leadership of our Voyagers class after the departure of John Thill, and has done a remarkable job of shepherding the class, and caring for the needs of other middle and mature adults. Dennis has a lively sense of humor, can be a prankster at times, and we found our affection growing for him and Penny each day we did ministry together. For these reasons we worked to increase Dennis's hours, even though the annual budget had decreased.

Sadly, Dennis and Penny's daughter, Sarah, received the difficult news that the cancer, which they believed to be in remission, had returned and spread. With only experimental treatment plans left, Dennis and Penny need to take some time to help Sarah and her family as she walks this very difficult path. Dennis and Penny have our unconditional support in this decision. There are times in life where you must be fully present, and we do not want Dennis to miss a single moment with his daughter. Our prayers continue to be for the miraculous; that Jesus in His infinite power would heal Sarah's body and restore her as He did with Jairus' daughter (Matt. 9:18), the man born blind (John 9:1), Lazarus (John 11:11), the ten lepers (Luke 17:11), and the 23 other miraculous stories in the gospels. We ask that you would pray the same for Sarah.

Our plan is to reconnect back with Dennis in September and reevaluate if he is able to continue with us in ministry. Until then, we are working on a contingency plan to care for the Voyagers class during the summer.

We are grateful that Richard Smith, our elder of Global Missions, will be stepping in weekly to ensure that all of their needs are being met and to provide shepherding care. We have also asked for Vance Hartzell and David Krall to be available to pick up additional pastoral appointments that may come up. Garrick Hanger has also put together a teaching schedule that will include Dr. Robert Cubillos, Steve Bunyard, David Krall, and other beloved members of the pastoral staff and the Voyagers class leadership.

We remain committed as a church to caring for the needs of the Voyagers class, and for all of the middle and mature adults at Rolling Hills Covenant Church. Galatians 6:10 tells us, "As we have the opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers." As a family, we want to care for the needs of those who built this church, who have given faithfully to provide significant ministries, and who often taught in our Sunday school classes and discipled those of us who were younger into a mature faith. Our sincere hope is that, in this season, our Voyagers class and the mature adults would feel each of us doing our best on their behalf.

Let us pray faithfully for Sarah's healing. Let us pray that God will return Dennis Fevegeon to us to continue the ministry that he so excellently began. Let us pray that the unity and love of the whole family of God will be seen in and through us in this difficult season. And may we bring joy to the heart of God by being "like minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and purpose" across all generations at RHCC (Phil. 2:2).
