

David Kochlhas got to go.

The Board of Trustees is responsible for holding WGBH accountable to its mission, including "fostering an informed and active citizenry." Oil and gas multibillionaire David Koch sits on the Board and the Science Visiting Council. This is the same David Koch who's donated tens of millions of dollars to climate change denial think-tanks, proactively seeking to misinform Americans and undermine accurate scientific reporting. From 2003 to 2010, foundations affiliated with David Koch and his brother, Charles, funded climate denialist organizations to the tune of \$26 million—while the portion of Americans who believe that Earth's temperature rise over the last century is due to natural causes, rather than human activity, climbed from 33% to 46%.1

Koch is not fulfilling his obligation as a board member to uphold WGBH's commitment to educating the public. He recently resigned from the board of New York's WNET after questions of conflict of interest and self-censorship arose around the documentaries "Park Avenue: Money, Power, and the American Dream" and "Citizen Koch".2 In the uncertain funding environment of public broadcasting, where ambitions often outstrip resources, is WGBH placing money over mission? If Koch were a major funder of "research" to show that tobacco doesn't cause cancer, would WGBH take his money? Yet the scientific certainty that humans cause global climate change is the same as that surrounding the assertion that cigarettes kill. ³

Board Chair Amos Hostetter, Jr. has said Koch brings "diversity" to the board, and that there is no "political litmus test" for board members.⁴ But this is **not about politics.** Climate change is not something that reasonable people can disagree about, and **climate change denial** is **not just another "diverse" political viewpoint.** It's a systematic effort to mislead the American public about scientific fact. And for the Kochs, that confusion directly supports their bottom line.

David Koch's record of misinformation:

Financing climate denialism ▶

A recent peer-reviewed study published by Drexel University found that foundations

affiliated with David Koch are among the largest sources of funding behind climate science denial, contributing \$26.3 million to organizations at the core of the anti-science effort from 2003-2010. Other studies show that since 1997, Koch-affiliated foundations have given more than \$67 million to organizations that work to miseducate the public about climate change.

Fighting climate solutions ▶

Organizations funded by David Koch are among the most strident opponents of

efforts to reduce climate pollution and promote clean, renewable energy at the state and federal level. Americans for Prosperity, founded and heavily funded by David Koch, recently attacked the Northeast's climate accord, the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative (RGGI), decrying it as "the biggest conspiracy between the public sector, big banks, and government that Americans have ever seen."

Undercutting public broadcasting ▶

David Koch may seem to be a friend of public broadcasting,

but the Kochs fund entities seeking to make funding cuts to PBS so massive they dwarf David Koch's donations to WGBH. In addition to Sens. Jim DeMint (R-SC) and Tom Coburn (R-OK), who from 2004-2010 received totals of \$76,000 and \$53,800 from individual and Koch PAC contributions, respectively, Koch Industries is a top-ten contributor to Rep. Doug Lamborn (R-CO), who has repeatedly pushed for the elimination of funding for the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB). Because of the sequester, for which Americans for Prosperity campaigned vigorously, CPB lost \$23 million in 2013 and had to eliminate 15 positions. The Koch-run Cato Institute has voiced clear opposition to public broadcasting: "When government brings us the news—with all the inevitable bias and spin—the government is putting its thumb on the scales of democracy."

How to get involved:

If you work at WGBH...

- Talk to your coworkers.
- **Discuss** with your supervisor whether s/he is receptive to bringing your and your coworkers' concerns up the management chain.
- Approach the Board of Trustees, perhaps through a trusted intermediary such as a recently retired board member; the Community Advisory Board may also be receptive.
