Among their proposals was a recommendation that the college "try to recruit and en-courage the enrollment of black students from community junior colleges and also courage black transfer students

It was also proposed that the college negotiate with institutions offering summer enrichment programs for Swarthmoreyoungsters them.

This was seen as an effort to prepare Negroes who might not otherwise be able to meet the college's entrance standards.

In additional recommendations Saturday, the faculty and administration had urged the appointment of a black counselor for Negro students and formulation of a "post enrollment support program" that would aid black students after they enroll.
