

College Names 14 to Faculty

A director of black studies and a new director of dramatics are among the 14 new faculty appointments for 1970-71 at the college.

Clement Cottingham, Jr., assistant professor at California State College at Hayward, will be teaching two courses as well as administering the black studies program adopted this year. Cottingham, 33, is the

son of Mrs. Cottingham, Sr., of Ambler and the late Mr. Cottingham. He graduated from Ambler Joint High School and received a B.A. from Lincoln University, master of public administration from the University of California at Los Angeles and a Ph.D. in political science from the University of California at Berkeley.

Lee Devin, assistant professor of drama at Vassar College, will join the faculty this fall as associate professor of English and director of theater. Devin, who has acted in, produced and directed dramatic

productions for more than 10 years received an A.B. from San Jose State College (California) and an M.A. and Ph.D. in English from Indiana University. He has won several playscript awards.

Other appointments include distinguished authority on Greek History, Russell Meiggs of Balliol College, Oxford, as Cornell Visiting Professor of Classics. Meiggs, author of a forthcoming history of the Athenian Empire, taught at Swarthmore for one semester in 1963. A second new member of the Classics department will

be Mrs. Julia H. Geisser as assistant professor. A graduate of Brown with a Ph.D. from Edinburgh, where she was a Marshall Scholar, she has taught at Wellesley and Newton Colleges.

New associate professors next year will be Howard Pack, now assistant professor of economics at Yale University and Donald K. Swearer, now in the religion department at Oberlin College.

Jerome Herman Wood, Jr., who has taught at Brown and Temple Universities and Harvard College and Margaret

Anderson Yarvin who also has taught at Brown, will be assistant professors of history next year. Both are Woodrow Wilson fellows receiving their Ph.D.'s from Brown. Mrs. Yarvin is a Swarthmore graduate.

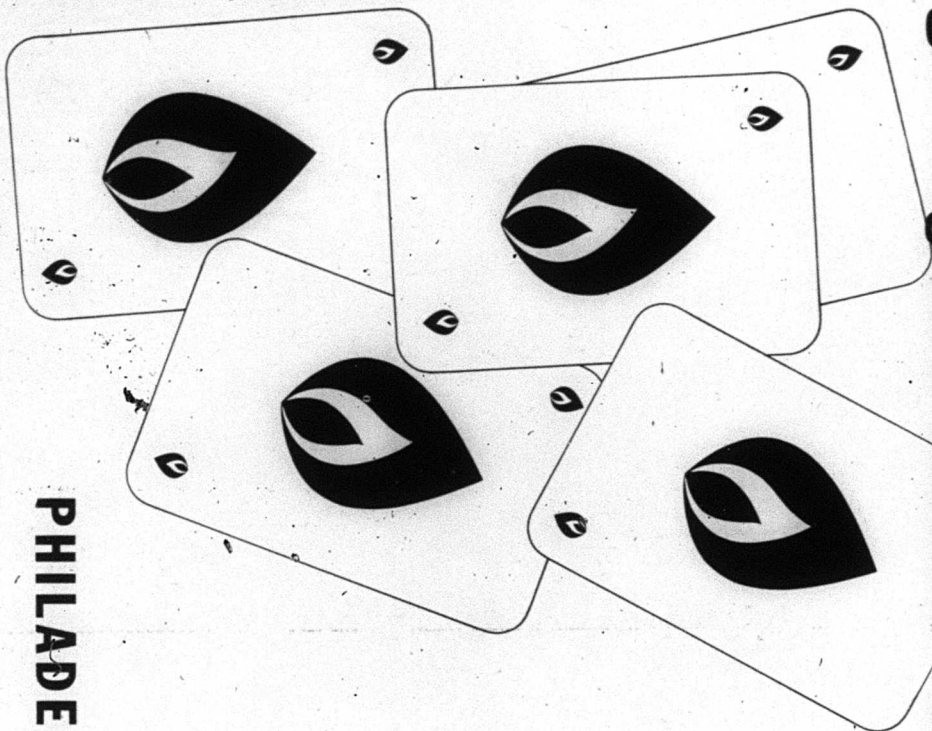
Other assistant professors include Hans-Eberhard Mueller, for the sociology department, Mrs. Jennie-Keith Ross for anthropology, James C. Hickman for biology, and Jeffrey Travers for psychology. Mrs. Ross is returning to Swarthmore where she served as a lecturer two years ago. Two instructors are also

joining the faculty. Eleanor Jane Hedley will teach English literature; Harry Harding, Jr., will be teaching political science.

Mrs. Margaret Yarrow, of Yale avenue is chairman of the committee for the dinner to precede the meeting.

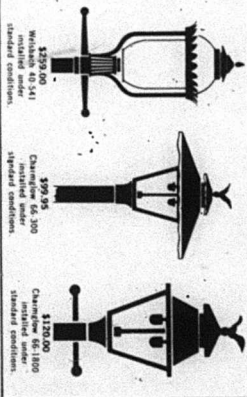
