The "pursuit of truth" is a dangerous term since in a period of changing value systems one man's truth is another man's lie. I suggest the statement read: "Academic institutions exist for the transmission of knowledge, the pursuit of useful change, the development of students, and the general well-being of society." The essential ingredient of governance today is adaptability to change. Indeed, wise governance encourages change, creates change, and structures change.
