I have just been reading about the subject of black students in the January Issue of Fortune and in today's Wall Street Journal. Both articles were go nal. Both articles were good but most illuminating of all is the report of the Harvard fac-uity committee in The New York Times of January 22. I wish I could quote it here in

In the light of these articles, nt behavior at Swarthmore and elsewhere can be seen as almost pathetic rather than actually criminal. There are the kids: plenty bright but poorly prepared (through no fault of their own), a small and con spicuous minority in a strange new world, fearful of what their own people think of them and ex-pect of them, and faced with demanding courses some of which do not seem to them to be rel-

evant to their lives.
Empathy is meeded more than condemnation. These black stu-dents do have legitimate aspirations and they do press them for a while in non-violent, dem ocratic ways. They probably would have achieved them at Swarthmore if they had been a bit more patient, since they did have such wide suppor ngst the college commun-But who has the gall to counsel black people to have more patience at this late date?

It is true that presenting non-negotiable" demands and barricading themselves in an office smacks of "taking over but what are their demand They don't ask the Board Trustees to abdicate, or for power to run the whole college. All they want is greater rec-ognition, more understanding, proportional representation of cks in the student body, the faculty, and the administration some new courses which Harvard now concedes are of academic value, and a meeting place they can call their own. I agree with you that responsibility and power must go to-gether. I believe the former will come as soon as some of the latter is obtained.

By calling for violent ejection by the police as the right re-sponse to a sit-in, the moral issue is compromised. It then es merely a matter of choosing sides and both claiming that "the end justifies the

nts should be grateful for their opportunities. On the other hand, our society, cannot afford to allow any ofits eager, or over-eager, young people to remain uneducated. It would be short-sighted in-deed to reject them even when they outrage us by some of their tactics. Militant students must be made to realize that violent actions are wrong, but college administrators and the public must become aware that they can sometimes be blind. If both can change soon enough all will be well.
