According to the "Philadelphia Inquirer" there are 47 Negro students at Swarthmore. About 20 black students seized the admissions office at noon Thur tsay.

Jordan was convicted here on charges of carrying a concealed weapon, violation of the Uniform Firearms Act, and carrying and possession of bombs or explosives.

The charges followed Jordan's arrest May 10, just be-fore the Selective Service ofwas damaged by fice bombs. Police testified that they took a revolver and Molotov cecktail from Jordan at his arrest.
