

Sam Jordan On Scene At Swarthmore Clash

Samuel R. Jordan, appealing his conviction on bomb and gun charges here, has been identified as one of the many non-student activists present during the current upheaval at Swarthmore College.

The college Thursday was struck by black dissidents who barricaded themselves within the admissions office and maintained control of the facility.

HOLDING OFFICE

Friday night the students still held the office despite a rebuke by the faculty. Among their demands is black interest in policy decisions.

Jordan's actual role in the dispute is unknown. Drew Pearson, a graduate of

Swarthmore whose sister, Mrs. Barbara Pearson Lange, is dean of women at the college, charges in his column due to be released Monday that Jordan was at the college "to direct revolutionary activities..."

CHARGE UNTRUE

A student spokesman at the college, however, Friday night said that the charge is untrue. "He isn't a leader; he's just here" the student, who said he didn't want to be identified, said.

Another student said later that Jordan was "far from the center" of dissident activities.

"There are a lot of black students and non-students here," said the first student.

47 NEGRO STUDENTS

According to the "Philadelphia Inquirer" there are 47 Negro students at Swarthmore. About 20 black students seized the admissions office at noon Thursday.

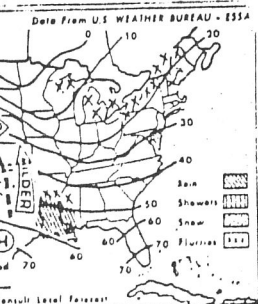
Jordan was convicted here on charges of carrying a concealed weapon, violation of the Uniform Firearms Act, and carrying and possession of bombs or explosives.

The charges followed Jordan's arrest May 10, just before the Selective Service office was damaged by fire bombs. Police testified that they took a revolver and Molotov cocktail from Jordan at his arrest.

During his trial Jordan claimed that he had picked up the Molotov cocktail on the street and was going to dump it down a sewer. He claimed he was trying to forestall trouble at the time of his arrest.

Jordan, of Washington, D.C., a former Franklin and Marshall College student, currently free under \$17,000 bond.
