The core OBPP materials include:

- **OBPP Teacher Guide** is the primary resource for teachers and support staff.
- **OBPP Schoolwide Guide** provides step-by-step implementation assistance for administrators and Bullying Prevention Coordinating Committees (BPCCs).
- **Olweus Bullying Questionnaire** is a simple, cost-effective way to ask students about the status of bullying in your school. The results give you the information you need to focus your bullying prevention efforts. Questionnaires are available online, in print, or Interactive Whiteboard format.

Supplemental materials, such as resources for class meetings, training videos for parents and educators, and cyberbullying curricula are also available to help you enhance the program. Both core and supplemental resources are available in print format or as an electronic subscription. Costs depend on the number of school staff, coordinating committee members and students. ## Training and Ongoing Consultation

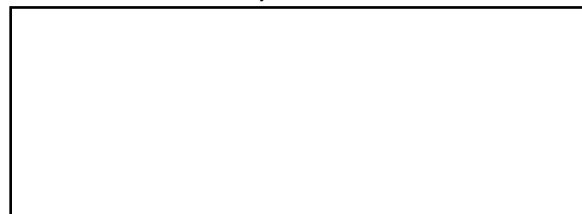

## What is OBPP?

The Olweus Bullying Prevention Program\* (OBPP) is the world's foremost bullying prevention program. With over 30 years of research and successful implementation in the U.S. and abroad, this whole-school program is specifically designed to prevent and reduce bullying throughout a school setting, K-12.

OBPP is implemented at the schoolwide, classroom, individual, and community levels and includes tools to engage families for involvement and support. OBPP is used throughout an entire school setting and encourages involvement from all students, educators, staff, counselors, and parents. OBPP is designed to create positive changes in students' behavior and in the school climate so students feel safe, are ready to learn, and can achieve academic success.

## Program Goals

OBPP is designed for students in elementary, middle and high schools. All school personnel and students are involved in learning about bullying, identifying roles people play in bullying situations, and prevention and intervention strategies to create a safe and welcoming school climate. Individual attention is given to students who are bullying others, those who are being bullied, or both. Families are involved throughout the program.

The three main goals of the program are:

- To reduce existing bullying problems among students;
- To prevent the development of new bullying problems;
- To achieve better peer relations at school.

## Program Benefits

- Substantial reductions in self-reports of bullying others and being bullied.
- Significant reductions in antisocial behavior, including vandalism, fighting, theft, and truancy.
- Improvements in the social climate of classrooms, as reflected in students' reports of improved order and discipline, more positive social relationships, and more positive attitudes toward schoolwork and school.
- Positive changes in students' attitudes about bullying and perceptions of teachers' and students' actions to stop bullying.
- Program effects are stronger the longer the program is in place.
