

## **Trautmann Middle School Parent & Family Engagement Policy**

The school will convene the meeting at a time convenient for parents and will offer a flexible number of additional parent engagement meetings, such as in the morning or evening, so that as many parents as possible are able to attend.   - Campus Report Card may also be viewed on TMS webpage
- 7. Trautmann Middle will take the following actions to provide each parent timely notice when their child has been assigned or has been taught for four (4) or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified within the meaning of the term in section 200.56 of the Title I Final Regulations (67 Fed. Reg. 71710, December 2, 2002) by:
  - A letter is sent home to parents
  - Parents may request a conference with teacher/ counselor/ or administrator
- 8. Trautmann Middle will provide assistance to parents of children served by the school, as appropriate, in understanding topics by undertaking the actions described in this paragraph:
- the state's academic content standards,
- the state's student academic achievement standards,
- the state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments,
- the requirements of Title I Part A,
- how to monitor their child's progress, and
  - how to work with educators: (Parent Learning Summit, Monthly Parent Meetings, Orientation Mtg.)

- 9. Trautmann Middle will provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement, such as literacy training and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement, by:

  - Parent Meriendas
  - Parent Learning Summit
- 10. Trautmann Middle will, with the assistance of its parents, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools, by:
