Student Health Services - Standing Orders

Winfield R-IV School District has established the following standing orders with guidance from Dr. Bradley Massey to serve our students more efficiently. The school nurse and health service professionals **will have the authority to administer medications** as stated for basic treatment for minor illness and injury while at school.

**Generic version of all OTC medications is acceptable **

Over the Counter Medications – (Administered according to package directions)

This list of over the counter medications is all inclusive. Please **DO NOT** cross out items. If your student cannot have one of the items listed due to an allergy, you will need to list it as an allergy on the Health Inventory Form and it will not be given by the nurse.

Acetaminophen and Ibuprofen

Acetaminophen	PK-5	Recommend 10-15 mg/kg every 4 hours for fever or pain.	*Ibuprofen and acetaminophen will be limited to a combined total of 6 doses per school year. This standing order form must be signed and on file before the nurse can begin administering.
Ibuprofen	PK-5	Recommended: 10mg/kg every 6 hours as needed for fever or pain. 200mg tablets 1 tablet if 44lbs-87lbs or 2 tablets if greater than 88lbs	
Acetaminophen	6-12	Recommended: 10-15 mg/kg every 4 hours for fever or pain. 325mg tablets 1-2 tabs 500mg tablets 1-2 tabs WILL NOT EXCEED 15MG/KG EVERY 4 HOURS	*Ibuprofen and acetaminophen will be limited to a combined total of 6 doses per school year. This standing order form must be signed out and on file before the nurse can begin administering.
Ibuprofen	6-12	Recommended: 200mg-400mg every 6 hours for fever or pain 1-2 tablets every 6 hours	

Emergency Situations ONLY

Medication	When	Comments
Nebulizer Albuterol 2.5 mg	PRN wheezing Dyspnea. *Only for Distress	Call 911 or arrange for urgent evaluation by physicians.
Epi-Pen and Epi-Pen Jr. Children < under 65LBS: 0.15mg Children > over 65LBS: 0.30mg	May be used for PRN for anaphylaxis, which is a life-threatening type of allergic reaction that is rapid in onset and may cause death. * A repeat dose may be required for severe or persistent anaphylaxis until EMS arrives.	Call 911 immediately and alert parents
Benadryl PK-5 Liquid 1 or 2 teaspoons (12.5mg – 25mg) x 1 6-12 1 or 2, 25mg capsules x1	For allergic reaction without signs of anaphylaxis if parents cannot be reached.	Continue trying parents and if necessary call 911

****BLOOD GLUCOSE TESTING---**With presented signs or symptoms of SEVERE Hyperglycemia/Hypoglycemia only and at the discretion of the nurse only.

****ADULTS ONLY ---**In case of cardiac emergency/chest pain, ASA (Aspirin) 81mg (chewable) 4 tablets PRN.

SCHOOL MEDICATION POLICY

Medications will be given by the Nurse or Trained Staff only with written authorization from a parent/legal guardian.

The Winfield R-IV School District requires that ALL Students who need medication during school hours MUST do the following:

OVER-THE-COUNTER MEDICATION:

The school has this "Physician Standing Order" form for specific medications and treatment. ***In order for your student to receive the listed medications, the parent/legal guardian must completely fill out and sign the Student Health Profile form, and it must be on file in the nurse's office.*** If you wish for your student to receive any over-the-counter medications **NOT** listed on the Physician Standing Order form, you must **provide the medication and and a signed Medication Consent Form to the nurse office.**

(Exception for Potentially Harmful Administration: The District will not knowingly administer any medication to a student that exceeds the highest recommended dosage listed in the volume of the Physician Desk Reference or other recognized medical text.)
