

TITLE I PARENT INVOLVEMENT POLICY

The Blanchard Board of Education is dedicated to providing a high quality education for every student in the district; endorses the parent involvement goals of Title I; and encourages the regular participation by parents of Title I eligible children in all aspects of the program. The education of children is viewed as a cooperative effort among the parents, school, and community. In this policy, the word “parent” also includes guardians and other family members involved in supervising the child’s education.

Pursuant to federal law, the district will provide coordination, technical assistance, and other support to assist Title I, Part A schools in planning and implementing effective parental involvement activities to improve student academic achievement and school performance.

The district and school shall provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children’s achievement.

The district and school must educate teachers, pupil services personnel, principals, and other staff, with the assistance of parents, in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners to implement and coordinate parent programs, and build ties between parents and the school

When possible, the district will coordinate with Head Start, Even Start, public preschool and other programs, and conduct other activities that encourage and support parents in more fully participating in the education of their children

The district will develop jointly with, agree on with, and distribute to parents of children participating in the Title I program a written parent involvement policy.

A meeting of the parents of participating Title I students will be held annually to explain the goals and purposes of the Title I program.

Parents will be given the opportunity to participate in the design, development, operation, and evaluation of the program for the next school year and to participate in planning activities, to offer suggestions, and to ask questions regarding policies and programs. Parents will be encouraged to attend the meeting and to become involved. In addition to the required annual meeting, additional parent meetings shall be held, at various times of the day and/or evenings, for parents of children participating in the Title I program. Notices will be sent to the parents and articles will appear in the local newspaper advising parents and interested persons of the meetings. These meetings shall be used to provide parents with

1. Information about programs provided under Title I;
2. A description and explanation of the curriculum in use, the forms of academic assessment used to measure student progress, and the proficiency levels students are expected to meet;

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3. Provide individual student academic achievement results and if necessary interpretation of the results to limited-English proficient parents in a language they can understand;
4. Opportunities to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their children; and
5. The opportunity to bring parent comments, if they are dissatisfied with the school's Title I program, to the district level.

Title I funding, if sufficient, may be used to facilitate parent attendance at meetings through payment of transportation and childcare costs.

The parents of children identified to participate in Title I programs shall receive from the school principal and Title I staff an explanation of the reasons supporting each child's selection for the program, a set of objectives to be addressed, and a description of the services to be provided. Parents will be advised of their children's progress on a regular basis. Opportunities will be provided for the parents to meet with the classroom and Title I teachers to discuss their children's progress.

Parents will also receive information and training that will assist them in monitoring school progress and helping their children at home and at school.

Each school in the district receiving Title I funds shall jointly develop with parents of children served in the program a "School-Parent Compact" outlining the manner in which parents, school staff and students share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement in meeting state standards. The compact shall:

1. Describe the school's responsibility to provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment enabling children in the Title I program to meet the state's academic achievement standards;
2. Indicate the ways in which each parent will be responsible for supporting their children's learning, such as monitoring attendance, homework completion, monitoring television watching, volunteering in the classroom, and participating, as appropriate, in decisions related to their child's education and positive use of extracurricular time; and
3. Address the importance of parent-teacher communication on an on-going basis, with at a minimum, parent-teacher conferences, frequent reports to parents, and reasonable access to staff.

Blanchard Intermediate School School Parental Involvement Policy

PART I: General Expectations

The Blanchard Intermediate School agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

5. ***The Blanchard Intermediate School*** will submit to the district any parent comments if the school wide plan under section (1114)(b)(2) is not satisfactory to parents of participating children. Submission of comments will be made to the Superintendent or Federal Programs Director and parent will be notified by the district for conference.
