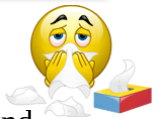

A Note From Our Nurse...



The Flu is here! Gruver ISD has been hit hard by the flu this week. I wanted to remind everyone of the ways we can prevent the flu from spreading in our schools and community. Symptoms of the flu include fever, cough, sore throat, runny nose, body aches, headache and sometimes vomiting and diarrhea. The flu spreads mainly by droplets made when people cough, sneeze or talk. Also, people might get the flu by touching something that has the virus on it. You can spread the flu up to 24 hours before you even show symptoms! If you have symptoms or the flu, out of respect for others in our community and school, **STAY HOME!** Do not go to basketball games, the stock show, the grocery store, church, and especially school! If your child has fever, do not send them to school even if it improves with Tylenol or ibuprofen! We are required to send students home from school if they have fever over 100.4. You must remain out of school until you have been fever free for 24 hours **WITHOUT USE OF FEVER SUPPRESSING MEDICATION (TYLENOL/IBUPROFEN).**
