

# **Campus Spotlight: Lincoln Elementary**

Lincoln welcomes four new staff members this year. T-Yanna Devericks from South Dakota is teaching kindergarten and also coached 8th grade girls at West. This is her first year to teach. She completed her degree at the University of Sioux Falls, South Dakota. Dawn Long is from the Guymon, Oklahoma area and is the new Instructional Coach. She has approximately 30 years of teaching experience. Melissa Heathman completed her student teaching in the Fall 2014 and began as Lincoln's Interventionist this semester. She assists staff with testing of students, as well as working individually with students. She has a 16 year old daughter who attends Liberal High School. Other staff changes that took place include Kris Classen transferring to the IRC position for this school year from Title position. Nichele Cauble transferred from teaching Pre-K at Washington Elementary to Lincoln to teach first grade. Kristine Patton, a second year veteran of Lincoln Elementary, was selected among the district's teachers who successfully completed their first year and are in their 2<sup>nd</sup> year as the Elementary Horizon Award Nominee. Kristine grew up in Liberal, attending Southlawn Elementary, South Middle School, and Liberal High School. She attended and graduated from Emporia State University in May 2013. She began teaching First Grade at Lincoln Elementary in the fall semester of 2013. A new program Lincoln Elementary has implemented this year is called Lincoln Leaders. Each month, the teachers and students focus on one of the character traits. These character traits stem from lessons taught by school counselor, Mike Johnson. As students model these character traits, they may receive a ticket on which they put their name and class. At the end of the month, a Lincoln Leader is drawn from those who have demonstrated that trait. The students drawn receive a certificate and other items to congratulate and recognize them for the job well done.

# **Breaking Ground: USD 480 Bond Projects Begin**

The USD 480 Bond Project is well underway. Five new schools will be built upon project completion. One building, MacArthur Elementary, will keep the name, although a new building will be built on the site. Suggestions for the other four new building names were submitted by students throughout the district. The four other new buildings will be: Prairie View Elementary, Meadowlark Elementary, Seymour Rogers Middle School, and Eisenhower Middle School. Following a ground breaking at the Seymour Rogers Middle School/Prairie View Elementary Site on December 9th, man power and equipment have begun to move. "It's really getting exciting as we get to the point of actual construction gearing up. The ceremonial groundbreaking was nice, but I'm excited the equipment is moving in to do the real work," said Paul Larkin, Superintendent of Schools. According to Vanessa Jones, Bond Project Manager, physical work has begun on two of the five sites. At the Seymour Rogers Middle School / Prairie View Elementary School, site clearing for access roads and right of way for utility service re-location for AT& T, Southern Pioneer and Zito Media is complete. Relocation of these services is expected to take 5-7 weeks weather permitting. This will allow USD 480 to meet their projected start date of March 2,2015 for construction of the Prairie View Elementary School. At the Eisenhower Middle School site, the construction trailer for JE Dunn has been delivered, and equipment for preliminary earthwork is on site. Excavation, grading, and leveling of existing contours to meet design specifications has begun and is expected to take 4-6 weeks weather permitting. Temporary fencing, facilities, construction parking, staging areas and access roads are forth coming. The acquisition of land for a third site is in the process. Jones also provided information regarding the Meadowlark Elementary School progress. "USD 480 is proceeding with the eminent domain procedures to acquire the property located at the intersection of Eleventh & Calvert referred to as the Smith Site. The appraisals for the site are due in court February 5,2015." Meanwhile, district staff and administration have begun to plan and prepare for the transition process. "A "West Middle School Task Force" has been created to determine what courses will be offered on that campus once it becomes a part of Liberal High School. A "Sixth Grade Task Force" has also been formed to shape what sixth grade will look like at the new middle schools," explained, Renae Hickert, Deputy Superintendent of Schools. Resolve to help your child make (and keep!) academic resolutions It's New Year's resolution time again! This year, encourage your child to come up with a few school-related resolutions for herself. If she's stumped about where to start, suggest she make resolutions regarding:

- Projects. If your child typically puts off big assignments until the last moment, help her turn over a new leaf. The next time a book report or a research paper looms, she should break it into small parts and assign a deadline for each part. That way she can tackle one piece at a time.
- Homework. If your child's study habits are haphazard, refine them. Instead of letting her hit the books "whenever and

after-school schedule. Figure out the best time for studying and make that part of her daily routine.



"My favorite thing about school is learning cursive because my mom's really proud of me. I'm really good at math and science, and when I show my mom, she says, "That's interesting."


