The results of the APNA survey that was given to our Middle and High School students, indicated that tobacco and alcohol use was an area of concern in our district. This program/curriculum has been implemented to help address these issues with primary-aged children in an effort to educate and prevent these high risk activities. Teachers were surveyed to check the carryover into the classroom of the counseling lesson. 45% said they did hear terminology from the guidance lesson in the classroom. 64% said the program gave them a reference point to talk with students about sharing. 73% said the program gave them a reference point to talk with students about taking turns. 91% agreed that students knew they should treat others they way they want to be treated.
