\*QZAB and Facilities Planning—Received notification from KSDE that the district is 1st in line to receive Zero Interest QZAB federal support in the amount of \$755,000. Superintendent Wiseman submitted an application for \$3 million worth of QZAB's last year. The

district remains 1st in line and eligible to receive approximately \$2.2 million. The Board authorized Mr. Wiseman to notify KSDE of the board's intent to accept the \$755,000 in QZAB bonds. The board will hold a special session to prioritize facility projects to be completed with the use of the QZAB. Payback on 24-year loan would be approximately \$31,500 per year.

\*The board took separate action on the retirement notification from Mrs. Susan Kramer. The board regretfully accepted the retirement notification from Mrs. Kramer, effective at the end of the school year. The board expressed their appreciation for many years of outstanding service Susan has given to the district and USD 377 students.
