- Approval of Minutes
- ❖ Bond and Facility Update- Mr. Baggett
  - New Stadium
    - Turf and track down
    - Rain has slowed construction
    - Will not be completed in time for any FB games this season
    - Projected completion is January 2015
    - Will host district track meet in April 2015
  - Ag Farm
    - As discussed last year, the district is looking to purchase land to move the Ag Farm
  - Cactus
    - Plan is to have Children's Hope students, technology dept., migrant program, parent liaison, and DAEP/EDGE housed at the campus
  - ➤ ABC
    - Installed 2 portable classrooms because large enrollment increase
  - Capitol
    - complete
  - South
    - Restroom and abatement projects are complete

- Cafeteria construction will take place in summer 2015
- Currently 6 double portables and restroom trailers with decks to make them ADA accessible
- Current projects are painting and ceiling renovations along with plumbing evaluation
- In 2005, Lowery Plumbing replaced sewer pipes from man hole to grease trap and did not use a lift or provide enough slope (according to recent camera probing used to investigate current plumbing problems). Possible solutions may include saw cutting the slab on top of pipes if it is determined pipes are collapsed and installing a lift station to combat slope and dips in current pipes.
- Ms. Kay Schreier addressed Mike and Allan stating that the backup of the sewer was very inconvenient and they should come spend a day in the classrooms to experience this. She also stated that the teachers' restroom had what she believed to be black mold and needed to be taken care of as well. The gentlemen stated they were aware of the situations and apologized for the inconvenience, but asked her to convey their thanks to the entire South community for their patience and support as they search for a solution to fix the problem permanently rather than a quick fix that will cost more money in the long run. Mr. Baggett also responded that he agreed we need to find a permanent solution and reiterated the problem and possible solutions. Ms. Schreier asked Mr. Baggett for a private meeting, so the two left to meet behind closed doors.

    - District is NOT \$6M over budget
      - Val Gonzales asked why this was published in the paper 2 times
      - Mr. Baggett was unclear why this was published
    - Intermediate IS included in the bond and is next to begin HUGE renovations
    - It is illegal to use bond money to supplement the budget
    - Fund balance can't be used for bond projects
    - Yes, there are some overages associated with the bond projects, but there are also some that are under budget
    - New stadium was TEA mandated, not a "because we wanted to" project
    - When the bond was voted on, the community results showed community pride in the existing school district buildings which resulted in remodeling rather than new building construction.
    - After the annex is vacated, the building and land will be sold.
