

Juniors who attend one of the five public high schools in Lea County are eligible to apply for the scholarship in the early spring of the school year and go through a rigorous process that includes interviews and a review of test scores, school activities, letters of recommendation, community service, and academic achievement. A panel selects five finalists from all qualified applicants. Each of these finalists are guaranteed a \$20,000 scholarship, but only one of the finalist is selected as the Jack Maddox Distinguished Scholar.
