EC Literacy Targeted Professional Development Plan

All Kindergarten through 3rd grade teachers and administrators will complete Reading Academy training in 2020-2021. In addition, Phonics Curriculum was purchased for grades PK-2nd Grade and professional development will be provided a minimum of six times by Wilson's Fundations and/or Heggerty Phonics. Ongoing Professional Development will be offered throughout the 2020-2021 school year. Campus focus will be on the inclusion model for Special Education and staff will be provided ongoing training and support monthly.

EC Math Targeted Professional Development Plan

PreK through 3rd Grade Math teachers will receive Professional Development through Region 5. K-3 teachers will receive Renaissance Training for STAR Math. Gizmos and I-Station Math resources will be utilized and teachers supported with ongoing PD a minimum of three times per year. Campus focus will be on the inclusion model for Special Education and staff will be provided ongoing training and support monthly.

CCMR Targeted Professional Development Plan

Teachers and essential staff will receive CCMR professional development through Region 5. WHS administration and essential staff will ensue the following student engagement activities: College and Career Day Campus-Wide, Motivational Speakers, and College Visits. WHS will offer Dual Credit Courses, AP Courses and utilize technology resources to provide additional CTE coherent sequence opportunities. Xello will be provided as WISD college and career planning software. Professional Development will be led by High School Counselor.
