

KATHIE LOUISE CALLAWAY DYCHE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

INTENT AND CRITERION

Kathie Louise Callaway Dyche was an art teacher in the Enid Public Schools System for 18 years, most of those years at Emerson Junior High. Her family and friends, including many teachers, established this scholarship to honor her memory. Mrs. Dyche helped students express themselves and their emotions through art. Weighed above technique and talent, she valued ideas and expression in her students. She cared for all students and especially for those who trusted her and her counsel. She considered it an important part of her vocation to reach out to students who might otherwise be overlooked. The spirit of this scholarship is to honor students who study art and embody the students that Mrs. Dyche taught and loved.

Criteria:

1. Graduating Senior.
2. Planning to major in art or related areas in college, i.e., graphic design, visual communication.
3. Student must have been enrolled in high school art during his/her senior year.
4. If several students meet the criteria, preference will be given to students who had Mrs. Dyche as a teacher.
5. If there are no candidates meeting the above criteria, the committee will have the opportunity to consider students who are majoring in secondary education, preferably with a focus in the arts.

Award:

1. The recipient will receive a one-time scholarship of \$500.00 to the school of his/her choice.
2. This is an annual award to be awarded each year at the scholarship awards ceremony.
3. Each year, the Enid High School Scholarship committee will review candidates and select a recipient. The committee will take into account the recommendations of the high school art teachers.
4. In the event that the balance of the account falls below \$500.00, then the award will be for the amount left in the account and the scholarship will end that year.
