UPDATE FROM THE CEO... MERGER OF THE CARPINTERIA FIRST COMMITTEE & THE DOWNTOWN "T" BUSINESS ADVISORY BOARD

The Carpinteria First Committee and the Downtown "T" Business Advisory Board recently merged in an effort to reduce redundancy in marketing, volunteer endeavors, and increase efficiency in the use of public resources. The merged group as a whole will continue to focus on citywide projects and will continue to have separate funding sources.

Carpinteria First Committee

The Carpinteria First Committee was originally organized to implement the 1993 Marketing Plan which served to promote the local economy while keeping Carpinteria a quiet, friendly, small town. The Committee is tasked with supporting and organizing activities and events that create a welcoming and friendly place for tourists to visit, enhance community pride, and increase awareness and visibility of the unique qualities that Carpinteria offers. In addition, the Committee recently has taken on the responsibility of assisting the City in economic vitality efforts.

The New First Friday was introduced this month and the volunteer committee is now concentrating their energy on First Friday events - encouraging all Carpinteria Merchants to participate all-day Friday until Sunset (check out enclosed flier to see how you can participate).

The merged group as a whole will continue to focus on citywide projects funded separately from the Downtown "T" Advisory Board. All expenses for marketing/promotion activities related to Carpinteria First are incurred through the General Fund.

The Carpinteria First Committee consists of 7 members and meets the first and third Thursday of each month at City Hall. The public is welcome to attend.

<u>Downtown "T" Business Advisory Board</u> (DTBAB)

The Parking and Business Improvement Advisory Board was formed in 1990 to comply with a change in State Law. In compliance with local and State regulations, the DTBAB makes recommendations to the City Council concerning the use of revenues collected via the Parking and Business Improvement Area Assessment District for general promotion of business activities, economic growth and stability in the District, and general maintenance issues within the Downtown "T".

The Board prepares and presents an Annual Report to the City Council that addresses all matters related to the Assessment District, including the methods and basis of levying the assessments, and recommendations on use of funds collected by the District. The DTBAB will continue to perform the Assessment District duties.

Both the DTBAB and Carpinteria First finances will continue to be maintained separately.

The Downtown "T" Business Advisory Board consists of 5 members and meets on the first Thursday of every other month at City Hall. The public is welcome to attend.


