SAINT JOHN'S DEFEATS AMERICAN UNIVERSITY BY DECISIVE SCORE OF 38-7

First and Second String Men Used in Game; Scribes Score Twice in Tie.

SMITH TO LEE PASS FIRST TALLY IN GAME

St. John's scored its first convincing victory of the year last Saturday when it defeated American University by the decisive score of 38 to 7, in the Washington arena home field.

The Eagles started out strongly, scoring its first touchdown in the early minutes of play. However, the superior stamina of the Annapolis players was displayed and after the first quarter the host team never had a look.

After scoring two touchdowns in the opening period, the Johnnies added two more in the second and one in the third and fourth quarters.

Coach Ripps scored seven touchdowns of first and second string men throughout the game with the result that he found that his best men were among the freshmen and second stringers who likewise had had no chance to prove their worth.

No doubt the situation is a great deal more gratifying than it was at the beginning of the season.

The Black and Orange gamblers drew the first blood since after Eric Dwyer kicked the first of his long range goals from the kick off structure.

The Eagles finished in a few minutes and on a fourth down Dwyer Smith passed to Aubrey Lee who accompanied the remaining distance to the goal line for the first of the many Annapolis touchdowns.

The Scribes added the game-winning kick.

Smith, now playing as a fullback, passed to Aubrey Lee, who carried the ball over after a series of manuevers through the life line of the Eagle forward man had placed the ball in a scoring position.

Hosts Score First

The American University team was scored from a play when the Johnnies failed to stop a slight pass at back from Captain George Hertz to George Patterson which ended in a 14-0 after carrying the ball team into end zone.

Before the half was over the Johnnies had accounted for two more touchdowns resulting from a rapid running and aerial attack. The first came when Captain Mike Robinson had an all-out attack with a well timed cut back to get three yards and a touchdown.
