**1 RESOURCE FURNITURE**

Crafted from solid walnut, the Mister sideboard features adjustable interiors, including five removable drawers and seven removable shelves. Those options allow the unit to function as a sideboard, a desk or a bar.

**2 TEKNION**

Designed by Chris Wright and Steve Tsai, Journal is a wood casegood system that serves as a multilayered private office. The unit consists of residential-scale components, including a stand-alone, height-adjustable table, a built-in pivot bench, credenzas, cabinets and stackable storage units.

**3 ATOCHA DESIGN**

Handcrafted of natural and dyed black Italian Bolivar veneer, the Kick Back cocktail table rests on a steel base. The made-to-order piece features a recessed area to house a turntable, a cantilevered cutout for an amp, a niche sized to fit 125-plus vinyl records and a solid brass inset designed to hold a standard liquor bottle. The piece's bold, monochromatic stripes take cues from the 1960s Op Art furniture scene, as well as the 1980s Memphis Movement.

Stacy Garcia drew inspiration from mid-century design to create the Calabasas artisan furniture collection, including the cocktail table [shown]. This 42-by-42-by-18-in. piece's top features angled strips of chalk white on ash, natural zebra wood, espresso on kulin and russet brown on oak wood veneers, but can be specified in a choice of other materials, including glass and HPL options. The base is offered in a range of finishes.
