Wednesday – Luke 23

Who was calling for Jesus' crucifixion, and why were they calling for it? (vv. 18–25)

What does the thief on the cross teach us about salvation? (vv. 39–43)

What is the significance of the curtain tearing at Jesus' death? (v. 45)

Thursday – Luke 24

What does Jesus use to explain His ministry to the disciples? (vv. 25–27)

Did Jesus resurrect as a spirit or as a man? (vv. 36–43)

What is necessary to understand the Scriptures? (v. 45)

Friday – Acts 1

What is "the first book"? (v. 1)

To what famous passage in Matthew is verse 8 similar?

According to verse 22, what was the role of an apostle?
