- *What is the point the passage is making?*
- *What does this say about God?*
- *How should I apply this in my life?*

Monday – Matthew 21

If the people welcomed Jesus so enthusiastically, why was he crucified a few days later? (vv. 1–11)

Why did Jesus act so harshly toward a fig tree? (vv. 18–19)

Who do the two sons represent? (vv. 28–32)

Tuesday – Matthew 22

Who does the man without a wedding garment represent? (vv. 1–14)

What is the significance of the word “likeness”? (vv. 15–22)

In what way do all the law and prophets rest on these two commandments? (vv. 34–40)

Wednesday – Matthew 23

Who were the scribes and Pharisees in Jewish society?

Why were the scribes and Pharisees not truly righteous?

How does Jesus demonstrate the guilt of the scribes and Pharisees? (vv. 34–35)

Thursday – Matthew 24

Has the prophecy of verse 2 come true?

What is the abomination of desolation? (v. 15)

Can we know when Jesus will return? (vv. 32–51)

Friday – Matthew 25

How was the third servant wicked? (vv. 14–30)

Who are “the least of these”? (vv. 31–46)

What do we learn about heaven and hell in chapter 25?
