When studying the Bible, remember to pray first, then ask yourself the following questions about the passage.

- *What is the point the passage is making?*
- *What does this say about God?*
- *How should I apply this in my life?*

Monday – Matthew 26

Why was the woman justified in “wasting” the perfume? (vv. 6–13)

Why does Jesus tell his disciples that he will not drink wine again until they are in the kingdom? (vv. 26–29)

Why does Jesus ask the Father to keep the cup from him, when that was the very purpose of his coming? (vv. 36–54)

Tuesday – Matthew 27

Did Judas repent? (vv. 3–10)

What connections does Matthew 27:32–50 have with Psalm 22?

Why does Matthew include this story about the guards? (vv. 62–66)

Wednesday – Matthew 28

Why does Matthew include another story about the guards in verses 11–15?

How is the Great Commission connected with the Resurrection? (vv. 10–20)

What are the promises attached to the Great Commission? (vv. 18–20)

Thursday – Romans 1

What does it mean that the gospel is “the power of God”? (vv. 16–17)

Are people atheists because they are not persuaded by arguments for God’s existence? (vv. 18–23)

What sin does God give a culture over to, when that culture worships the creature rather than the creator? (vv. 26–27)

Friday – Romans 2

Why are people who don’t know the commands of Scripture still held accountable for sin? (vv. 1–16)

Why were the Jews condemned, even though they knew and taught God’s law? (vv. 17–24)

Does circumcision have value, according to these verses? (vv. 25–29)
