When studying the Bible, remember to pray first, then ask yourself the following questions about the passage.

- *What is the point the passage is making?*
- *What does this say about God?*
- *How should I apply this in my life?*

Monday – Romans 13

Why are Christians commanded to obey the government? (vv. 1–7)

What is “God’s wrath” referring to in verse 5?

What is the motivation for holiness in verses 11–14?

Tuesday – Romans 14

What issue was Paul referring to when he spoke of eating and drinking? (vv. 2–4)

To what issues does Paul’s command to “not pass judgment” apply? (vv. 1–23)

What are some of the reasons Paul gives for not judging? (vv. 4–23)

Wednesday – Romans 15

What is the motivation for Christians serving one another in verse 6?

What does it mean for Paul to be in “the priestly service” for the Gentiles? (vv. 14–21)

To whom does Paul refer to as “saints”? (vv. 22–33)

Thursday – Romans 16

Why does Paul tell the church to “greet one another with a holy kiss”? (v. 16)

To what verse in the Old Testament does “crush Satan under your feet” refer? (v. 20)

What are the “prophetic writings” Paul refers to in verse 26?

Friday – James 1

Who are “the twelve tribes in the Dispersion”? (v. 1)

Why does James mention asking for wisdom in the midst of talking about trials? (vv. 5)

If the person who only hears the word “looks at himself and goes away and at once forgets what he was like,” what does the doer of the word do? (vv. 22–27)
