Monday – James 2

Thursday – James 5

Why does James condemn the rich? (vv. 1–6)

How are verses 1–6 and 7–11 connected?

Why should we confess our sins to one another? (vv. 13–20)

Friday – 1 Thessalonians 1

What are the three virtues of verse 3?

What demonstrated that the Thessalonians were chosen by God? (vv. 4–10)

Why did the Thessalonians become so well known to the other churches? (vv. 6–10)
