When studying the Bible, remember to pray first, then ask yourself the following questions about the passage.

- *What is the point the passage is making?*
- *What does this say about God?*
- *How should I apply this in my life?*

Monday – 1 Corinthians 5

What do verses 3–5 reveal about the importance of the church assembling?

What does it mean to deliver someone to “Satan for the destruction of the flesh”? (v. 5)

Why does Paul rebuke the Corinthian church, even though it was just one individual who committed the heinous sin? (vv. 1–13)

Tuesday – 1 Corinthians 6

What are the faults of the church that has lawsuits amongst its members? (vv. 1–8)

Are the sexually immoral able to turn from their sin? (v. 14)

What harm does the sexually immoral person bring against Christ and the church? (vv. 12–20)

Wednesday – 1 Corinthians 7

Why does Paul indicate what he says and what the Lord says, when he is a spokesman for the Lord? (vv. 10, 12, 25)

What does it mean that an unbelieving husband or wife is made “holy” by their believing spouse? (vv. 12–16)

What is the blessing of being single? (vv. 32–35)

Thursday – 1 Corinthians 8

In verse 6, how does Paul compare and contrast the Father and Jesus Christ?

Why was there an issue in the Corinthian Church about eating or not eating meat sacrificed to idols? (vv. 1–13)

What was Paul’s guidance on how Christians should navigate this issue? (vv. 7–13)

Friday – 1 Corinthians 9

Do ministers have a right to be paid for their work? (vv. 3–12)

Why does Paul not insist on his rights? (vv. 12–23)

Why does the Christian life demand toil? (vv. 24–27)
