- *What is the point the passage is making?*
- *What does this say about God?*
- *How should I apply this in my life?*

Monday - 1 Thessalonians 2

What was Paul's motivation for sharing the gospel? (vv. 1-8)

How was Paul like a mother to the Thessalonians? How was he like a father? (vv. 7-12)

What does it mean that the Jewish leaders "filled up the measure of their sins"? (v. 16)

Tuesday - 1 Thessalonians 3

Why did Paul send Timothy to Thessalonica? (vv. 1-10)

For what does verse 3 say Christians are destined?

What is the connection between verse 10 and verses 11-13?

Wednesday - 1 Thessalonians 4

What are the three reasons Paul gives for abstaining from sexual immorality? (vv. 3-8)

What does it mean to “live quietly, to mind your own affairs, and to work with your hands”? (v. 11)

To what event do verses 16–18 refer?

Thursday – 1 Thessalonians 5

How should we prepare for the return of Christ? (vv. 1–11)

How are Christians supposed to treat their pastors? (vv. 12–13)

What are the different ways we should help other believers? (v. 14)

Friday – 2 Thessalonians 1

How does this chapter describe the wrath of God? (vv. 6–10)

Do you have to believe the gospel in order to be saved? (vv. 8)

According to verse 10, what is the purpose of Jesus’ return?
