Monday – 2 Thessalonians 2

Who is the man of lawlessness? (vv. 1–11)

What is God's purpose in sending the man of lawlessness? (vv. 9–11)

What does it mean to "obtain the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ"? (v. 14)

Tuesday – 2 Thessalonians 3

What are Paul's two prayer requests? (vv. 1–2)

How does Paul view work? (vv. 6–13)

How should we respond to those who profess Christ and yet persist in sin? (vv. 14–15)

Wednesday – 1 Timothy 1

What are the parallels between the Ten Commandments and the list of sins in verses 9–10?

Why did God save Paul? (v. 16)

What does it mean that Paul handed Hymenaeus and Alexander over to Satan? (vv. 19–20)

Thursday – 1 Timothy 2

How should we pray for our country? (vv. 1–3)

What is the connection between verses 4 and 5?

Is it for cultural reasons that Paul forbids women to teach men? (vv. 11–15)

Friday – 1 Timothy 3

Why are there such high character qualifications for overseers? (vv. 1–7)

What is a deacon? (vv. 8–13)

What is a “pillar” and what is a “buttress”? (v. 15)
