Week 29

When studying the Bible, remember to pray first, then ask yourself the following questions about the passage.

- *What is the point the passage is making?*
- *What does this say about God?*
- *How should I apply this in my life?*

Monday – Mark 5

Why did the crowds want Jesus to leave after he healed the demon-possessed man? (vv. 1–20)

What was the social position of Jairus compared to the woman? (vv. 21–43)

Why is the healing of Jairus' daughter and the healing of the woman included in one narrative? (vv. 21–43)

Tuesday – Mark 6

Why was Jesus rejected by his hometown? (vv. 1–6)

Why did the disciples anoint sick people with oil? (v. 13)

What motivated Jesus' ministry to the crowds in verses 33–44?

Wednesday – Mark 7

What does Mark's comment in verses 3–4 reveal about the identity of his audience?

Why didn't the disciples obey the rules of the pharisees? (vv. 1–13)

Why did Jesus not consider the woman one of His children? (vv.24–37)

Thursday – Mark 8

Why are these two instances of the same miracle recorded (see Mark 6:33–44)?

What is the relationship between the blind man being healed and the disciples not understanding Jesus? (vv. 14–26)

Why does Jesus not heal the man thoroughly the first time? (vv. 22–26)

Friday – Mark 9

Who is Jesus speaking of in verse 1?

How could the boy's father have belief and unbelief at the same time? (v. 24)

Why does Jesus put forth a child as an example in verse 36?
