- *How should I apply this in my life?*

Monday – Mark 15–16

Why did Jesus not respond when questioned? (vv. 1–5)

How could Jesus have been forsaken by God? (v. 34)

Why does Mark's Gospel end so abruptly? (16:1–8)

Tuesday – 1 Corinthians 1

Why is it important that Paul identifies the Corinthians with the other churches? (v. 2)

What was the most pressing issue of the Corinthian Church? (vv. 10–17)

Why is the gospel folly to the world? (vv. 18–31)

Wednesday – 1 Corinthians 2

In what way did Paul preach the gospel? (vv. 1–5)

What is the irrefutable proof that the rulers of this world are fools? (vv. 6–9)

Who is the “we” in verses 12–13?

Thursday - 1 Corinthians 3

What is wrong with being “merely human”? (v. 4)

What is the significance of being God’s temple? (vv. 16–17)

How does having all things diminish our pride? (vv. 21–23)

Friday - 1 Corinthians 4

In what way does Paul not judge himself? (vv. 1–5)

Is Paul serious in verse 8?

What seems to have been the Corinthians’ disposition toward the apostle Paul? (vv. 1–21)
