Monday – 1 Corinthians 15

What will our resurrected bodies be like? (vv. 35–49)

Tuesday – 1 Corinthians 16

When and how often did the early church meet? (v. 2)

Why does Paul command these five things? (vv. 13–14)

Who does Paul curse? (v. 22)

Wednesday – 2 Corinthians 1

What is the purpose of suffering? (vv. 3–11)

Why does Paul want the Corinthians to pray for him? (v. 11)

What is the reason that Paul is dedicated to telling the truth? (vv. 15–24)

Thursday – 2 Corinthians 2

What is Satan's design? (vv. 5–11)

What was a Roman triumphal procession? (v. 14)

Is Christian ministry successful, even if people reject the gospel? (vv. 14–17)

Friday – 2 Corinthians 3

What seems to be the issue between Paul and the Corinthians? (vv. 1–3)

How can people read the Bible and not see its obvious truth? (vv. 14–18)

How are Christians changed? (v. 18)
