When studying the Bible, remember to pray first, then ask yourself the following questions about the passage.

- *What is the point the passage is making?*
- *What does this say about God?*
- *How should I apply this in my life?*

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**Monday – John 17**

How will the Father glorify the Son? (vv. 1–5)

How are Christians sanctified? (vv. 15–19)

To what does Jesus compare the love of the Father for His people? (v. 23)

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**Tuesday – John 18**

Who is in charge in this encounter? (vv. 1–11)

Why did the Jews not kill Jesus themselves? (vv. 31–32)

Who demonstrates greater confidence and authority: Jesus or Pilate? (vv. 28–40)

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## **Wednesday - John 19**

Who do you think Pilate thought Jesus was? (vv. 1–22)

Why is the water and blood flowing from Jesus' side so significant to John that he goes to such lengths to affirm that he is not lying? (vv. 34–35)

Think of one Old Testament prophecy that is fulfilled in this chapter (there are many).

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## **Thursday - John 20**

Why does John give such detail in verses 1–11?

Why does Jesus breath on the disciples? (v. 22)

What is the connection between the story of Thomas and the purpose statement of verses 30–31?

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## **Friday - John 21**

Why does Jesus ask Peter three times, "Do you love me?" (vv. 15–19)

Why does Jesus tell Peter how he is going to die? (vv. 18–19)

Why does John include the autobiographical detail in verses 22–24?

*And so, from the day we heard, we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of his will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, so as to walk in a manner worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him: bearing fruit in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God. – Colossians 1:9–10*
